College Credit Plus Informational Meeting

If your son or daughter is interested in participating in the College Credit Plus (CCP) program for the 2020-21 school year, please plan to attend an information meeting on Tuesday, February 11, from 6:00 – 7:00 p.m. in the CHS cafeteria. This meeting will cover a variety of topics including application instructions and eligibility. Local college reps will also be present to give updated CCP information for their individual college/university. In order to participate in the CCP program during the 2020-21 school year the parent/guardian must either: 1) attend the informational meeting or 2) request a recording of the meeting from Mrs. Birr. All students interested in CCP must turn in an *Intent to Participate* form to their school counselor before April 1, 2020. Current CCP students and their parents do not have to attend the meeting/ request a recording, however they must submit the *Intent to Participate* form by April 1, 2020.

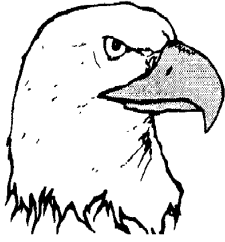
