Ordering a Class Ring

Junior ACT Administration

All junior students are scheduled to take the ACT on Wednesday, February 24. Wednesday was selected to avoid missing in-person class time. The State of Ohio requires that all students be offered the ACT for free during their junior year of high school. Every junior student has been registered and their participation is expected. Testing will run from 7:50 am until approximately 12:30 pm or if your child has ACT approved accommodations, the time for the test will be 7:50 am until 2:00 pm. Transportation will be provided for all junior students that contacted Mr. Sigg and notified him of their need for transportation. These special bus routes will be communicated directly to the students that contacted Mr. Sigg.

Juniors should leave all cell phones and book bags in their car or at home. Students are expected to bring a photo ID if available. If your child is unable to bring a photo ID, we can identify them through PowerSchool, but an ID will make the check-in process more efficient.
