Selective Service Registration

Parents, did you know that it is the law that all men must register with the Selective Service within 30 days of their 18th birthday? To help men register, they only need to go to SSS.gov. Men can preregister at 17 years and 3 months of age and their registration will be held until they reach the age of 18. Men who fail to register are unable to receive federally-funded college loans and grants, are unable to get into federally funded training and certification programs, are barred from all federal employment and ineligible for many state and local government jobs.

Girls Golf District Qualifier

The CHS Girls Golf Team had a good showing at the OHSAA Sectional Tournament on Wednesday, October 4, while golfing at Heatherdowns Country Club. Despite good play, the team missed qualifying for the District Tournament by just six strokes.
