## District Animal Management and Aquarium Management

Oregon-Clay FFA traveled to Penta Career Center to compete
in district Small Animal Management and District Aquarium Management on September 27th. Small Animal Management
contestants had to identify things like equipment, dog breeds, cat breeds, reptiles, and proper diets for certain animals. Aquarium Contestants had to identify fish, equipment, and show how to do a proper water test. Each group of kids had to take a written test in their category. The Small Animal Management Team received 4th place in the district while the District Aquarium Team took first place with Makayla Free placing first in the district! These kids will be competing in the State Competition during the first week of November. Wish these kids luck as they progress through!



# District Soils Career Development Event 

On September 26th, our Urban and Rural Soils teams competed in Elmwood for the District Soils contest. Participants examined the soil pits for factors such as mottling, organic matter content, and soil texture. Our Oregon Clay FFA members are experts on everything soil, and they truly showed their expertise in the pits! Our Rural Soils team placed 16th in the district and our Urban Soils team placed 10th.

## District Floral Career Development Event <br> On September 5th, three of our students competed in the district <br> Floriculture CDE. They prepared by studying and memorizing a <br> variety of plant species, pests and arrangement types. They were <br> tested on identification and their ability to make a corsage and <br> bud vase. After the District competition, teams will take on an <br> online state Floriculture test for the chance to move on to an in <br> 

person state floral CDE. Our students have done wonderful so far and we hope to see them succeed at state in the spring.


On September 5th, the senior Agriculture students took
a trip to Howard Marsh Metropark with Ohio
the history of the park's creation, the wildlife, invasive species, wetlands restoration, as well as kayaking throughout the beautiful marshes. The field trip was made possible through the H2Ohio program which is an initiative of Ohio to educate youth on watersheds as
well as improve Ohio's water quality. It was an enjoyable experience that allowed the students to explore the diverse ecosystems present right in their own backyard!


On September 26th, several students from the Oregon-Clay FFA competed in the online, district portion of the Forestry CDE. The participants were quizzed on forestry management, tree identification, and diagnosing forest disorders. Those who place high enough would move on as a team to compete in the state portion, which took place at Hocking College on September 30th.

## Soil Pit Field Trip

In September, juniors and seniors traveled to Jerusalem Township Kennedy Park to evaluate soil pit to determine the spectrum of soil properties! They also had lots of fun naming all sorts of plants
and flowers while there. They named topics such as depth of topsoil, to see if it's silt, clay, sand, and ?
loam. Also how deep the pit is. depths, colors, texture, structure, root density, rock fraction, etc.

This activity helped our students who were competing in the Soils Judging Career Development Event.


Juniors and Seniors spent a week this quarter being trained on CPR and First Aid to earn their CPR Certifications. They are now ready to save lives in the case of an emergency! In addition, students were taught canine CPR and vital signs from Missy and Chelsea from Maumee Bay Vet Hospital.

## State Greenhand Conference

1st year FFA members were able to attend the State Greenhand Conference at Versailles High School in Versailles, Ohio. Our students came together with hundreds of other first year FFA
 members from the state of Ohio. State and National FFA Officers ran different stations for students to learn about ways to get involved in FFA, complete team building activities, and build communication skills. This is the first opportunity for students to build their leadership skills, and these students dove right in to building their skills.


Greenhand is the name of the first degree students can earn through the FFA upon their first agriculture class.

## Officers Community Service

The Oregon Clay FFA Officer traveled to the
Toledo Zoo to help their staff plant Tulip bulbs. Our students were able to plant over 500 bulbs in the flower beds near the Conservatory. These tulips will bloom in the

Spring. They attended with the Anthony Wayne FFA where they were able to meet and mingle while getting their hands dirty. If you travel to the zoo in the Spring, please stop by the Conservatory to see the hard work our officers did.

Our seniors traveled to Wolf Creek located in the Oregon Recreation Center to test 7 different water quality parameters. They tested the macronutrients found in the water, nitrogen,

They were also given a YSI probe to use by TMACOG. It told us different different parameters: pH , dissolved oxygen, and temperature.

A few of the kids went down in the creek to catch macroinvertebrates using a kick sein. We found a plethora of species including the crayfish, a species the Ag room has not caught before at the creek. Our students made different types of presentations to be presented at The Student Watershed Watch Summit located at the Toledo Zoo.

MacQueen's Field Trip

Agriculture 3 was able to attend McQueen's Apple Orchard with the Clay Culinary Department. These students were given an in depth tour of how the apples are proceesed from planting the seeds to being bought by consumers. While there, we were able to walk the rows of tree and learn how they are pruned, tour the processing building where we saw apples get sorted based on size for different products, and see where the smaller apples are made into cider along with being packaged. They were even able to see and hear about the process of putting apples to sleep in refrigerators in order to use them in the following years for consumers.
