Below is general information regarding the Clay Semester Exams.

- 1) On exam days, school will begin at 7:50 am.
- 2) On Tuesday, Dec 19, students will take exams in periods 1-2-4, with dismissal at 12:15 pm. On Wednesday, Dec 20, students will take exams in periods 3-7-5, with dismissal at 12:15 pm. On Thursday, Dec 21, students will take exams in periods 8-6, with dismissal at 10:45 am.
- 3) All students must take the exam in every class. If an exam is not taken, the student will automatically fail the course for the semester, regardless of the quarter and/or semester grade in the class.
- 4) No student will be released early during the exam period. All students must stay in the room until the bell rings signaling the end of the exam period.
- 5) Late arrivals and early dismissals will be approved for lunch periods and study halls <u>only</u>. Students requesting early dismissals/late arrivals must submit a parent note to the appropriate study hall/13-minute study hall teacher no later than Monday, December 18, the day before exams begin.
 - If a student arrives late, the student must enter door #38 by the attendance office. All other doors will be locked.
- 6) Students may not leave school grounds and return for later exams. For example, if a student has a 1st and 4th period exam but a study hall 2nd period, the student must attend the 2nd period study hall. The student **cannot** attend 1st period, leave 2nd period, and then return for his or her 4th period.
- 7) Students are not permitted to visit other schools when they are finished with exams. All other schools are on a regular schedule and request that our students do not interrupt their day.
- 8) Regular dress code will be in effect.
- 9) If we have a 2-hour delay, exams will begin at 9:50 am, with dismissal at 2:35 pm.
- 10) BUSSES Will run as normal in the morning. Busses will run as normal at the conclusion of the exam day.
- 11) BREAKFAST Will be served as usual.
- 12) LUNCH A "to go" lunch will be served at the conclusion of the exam day.

If you have additional questions about exams, please ask your child. General announcements regarding exams will be made on the morning announcements during the week of Dec 11-15.



Here are six steps for you to complete between now and the end of 2023:

- 1. Submit at least one college admissions application
- 2. Search for scholarship applications
- 3. Complete and submit scholarship applications
- 4. Set up your personal FSA ID
- 5. Determine your FAFSA dependency status (independent or dependent)
- 6. Ensure each FAFSA contributor creates a unique FSA ID
