Gilder Lehrman Institute of American History

Congratulations to CHS Junior Danya Abdulhak for receiving the prestigious Gilder Lehrman National History Academy Scholarship. The scholarship for the four-week residential program is all inclusive and will cover the cost of room, board, learning materials, and admission to historical sites. Danya will spend four weeks on the campus of Foxcraft School just outside Washington DC. During these four weeks, Danya will walk in the footsteps of leaders who helped define and shape American history, including presidents, civil rights leaders, and soldiers who fought for the birth and survival of the nation. Admission to the Academy is a highly competitive process, with hundreds of students from across the country competing for just 90 spaces. CHS is proud that Danya will be one of those 90 students!

BPA National Competition

Last weekend, two CHS students competed at the Business Professionals of America (BPA) National Competition in Chicago. CHS junior, Andrew Amborski, competed in Database Applications and finished in the top 50% in his event in the country. Senior, Emma Fuller, qualified in the judged event of 3D Computer Modeling. Emma competed in the preliminary round on Saturday and was one of 12 students that qualified for the Final Round held on Sunday. If you have a PaySchools Central account created, you can check the account balance online for the amount of fees/fines owed. If you don't have an account, you may call the school (419-693-0665) and speak to Yvonne Ramos (ext. 2006) to inquire if there is a balance on your child's school account. Thank you for looking into this matter well before the end of school and eventually graduation.

Final Semester Exams

The last day of school for all CHS underclassmen is Friday, May 24. The last three days on the school calendar (Wednesday, May 22; Thursday, May 23; Friday, May 24) will be semester exams for all freshman, sophomore and junior students. Parents, please stress to your children that the semester exam is worth 20% of their final semester grade. Attached is an exam schedule for the final three days of the school year.

Attention Parents of 2025 Graduates

The Ohio Department of Health requires 12th graders to have the meningitis shot before beginning the new school year. Next year's seniors (current 11th graders) will need a MCV4 for the 2024-25 school year. This shot has to be given **after** the student is 16 years old to be valid for the requirement. This may mean a second shot could be needed to fulfill the requirement so that the student receives one MCV4 vaccine **after** his or her 16th birthday. It's not too early to get the shot now to avoid the rush, but **only if your son or daughter is over 16 now**. Shots may be obtained at the child's primary care physician, at area pharmacies, or at Nationwide Children's Health Center at Clay High School. Once your child has received the required vaccine, please submit all shot records to the CHS nurse. Please call the CHS nurse, Betsey Langford, at 419-693-0665 ext. 2040 with any questions.

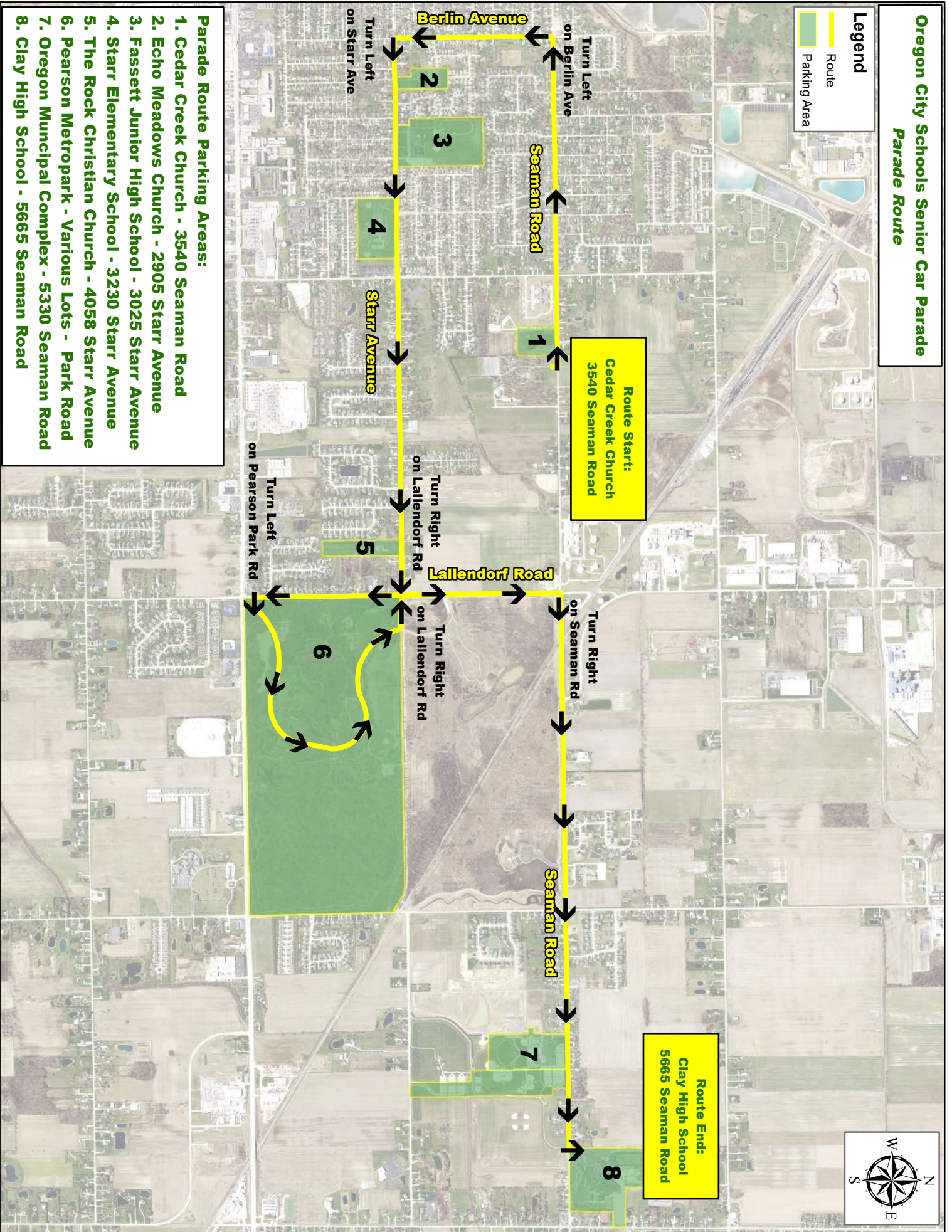
