Parent letters with specific information that may help place a child in the most appropriate setting need to be submitted to the building principal by the end of April.

Class balance is extremely important for the success of all our students. Rosters are composed with consideration to each individual's learning style, peer relationships, gender ratio, disciplinary concerns, and the academic needs of all our students. We appreciate you placing trust in the professionals who work with your children on a daily basis in the learning environment.

Your students have been learning more about coping skills this week along with how their body might feel during different types of strong emotions. They've also been learning different feeling words like frustrated, nervous, discouraged, among others. We talked about how it's important to use words other than mad or sad to describe how we are feeling to others so that they can be better in helping us through our emotions. I have many different Coping Skills sheets with different ideas of how to calm down by using different coping skills. If you're interested in using this at home, please reach out and I will send a copy of it home with your student.

On another note, I have started an informal "Shoe Tying Club" amongst our Kindergarten students. After realizing many shoes nowadays are velcro or slip-on, many of our students aren't practicing the skill of shoe tying. Shoe tying is very good for their fine motor skills as well as problem solving skills. Students have been encouraged by myself and their teachers to practice on their adult or sibling(s) shoes at home and some of our classrooms have fake shoes they can practice on while at school. I have a little certificate, a sucker, and a pencil if they show me they can tie their shoes. I have also hung a piece of paper outside the three Kindergarten classrooms where I display their name as they join the club. It has been interesting to see some of our older students see this piece of paper hung up and talk about how they don't know how to tie their shoes either! Kindergarten students will have until the end of the school year to join this fun, informal club I've created:D





Safety Town Sign-Up!

2024 Oregon Safety Town Registration

SAFETY TOWN is an organized safety education program for children entering kindergarten from Oregon and the surrounding communities. Safety awareness is taught and practiced in SAFETY

TOWN, a city built to a child's scale. Teachers, police, and fire personnel, with the assistance of teenage volunteers, will cover topics such as pedestrians, motorists, buses, railroads, water, and various other safety-related issues. Movies, songs, games, and practice inside SAFETY TOWN will complement the daily classroom activities. Each session is five days (see below for times). All children must be potty-trained.

The Oregonian Club sponsors SAFETY TOWN in cooperation with the City of Oregon's Police and Fire Departments and the Oregon City Schools. SAFETY TOWN is at 3230 Starr Avenue (Starr Elementary School) and offers two sessions—a limit of 60 students per session.

Session 1: June 3rd - 7th (8:00 am - 11:30 am), with Graduation on June 7th at 10:30 am Session 2: June 10th - 14th (8:00 am - 11:30 am), with Graduation on June 14th at 10:30 am

A \$30 registration fee must be paid before May 19, 2023. A full refund will be given if canceled before May 26, 2023, and a partial refund of \$10 if before June 2, 2023.
