Fun Day Updates.....

Our third annual Fun Day is fast approaching on the last day of school, Friday, May 24th! Our Coy PGA has worked very hard to put this event on for our families! Thank you! All Fun Day RSVPs are due to school by May 10th!



Please note that your children will bring all of their school supply belongings home on Thursday as they will not return to classrooms for any part of Fun Day.

For our event filled Fun Day, we ask that all families park in the Wal-Mart parking lot as there will be no parking available at Coy. A bus shuttle will run all day from 8:45 -1:30. However, if your child is attending Fun Day without a parent, our busses will run as normal. We do have an early dismissal for everyone on this day of 1:30.

(UPDATED) Upon arrival to Coy on Fun Day, your family will check-in under the front awning no earlier than 8:45. From there, you will receive a map laying out our events for the day. 2024 Oregon Safety Town Registration



SAFETY TOWN is an organized safety education program for children entering kindergarten from Oregon and the surrounding communities. Safety awareness is taught and practiced in SAFETY TOWN, a city built to a child's scale. Teachers, police, and fire personnel, with the assistance of teenage volunteers, will cover topics such as pedestrians, motorists, buses, railroads, water, and various other safety-related issues. Movies, songs, games, and practice inside SAFETY TOWN will complement the daily classroom activities. Each session is five days (see below for times). All children must be potty-trained.

The Oregonian Club sponsors SAFETY TOWN in cooperation with the City of Oregon's Police and Fire Departments and the Oregon City Schools. SAFETY TOWN is at 3230 Starr Avenue (Starr Elementary School) and offers two sessions—a limit of 60 students per session.

Session 1: June 3rd – 7th (8:00 am – 11:30 am), with Graduation on June 7th at 10:30 am
Session 2: June 10th – 14th (8:00 am – 11:30 am), with Graduation on June 14th at 10:30 am

A \$30 registration fee must be paid before May 19, 2023. A full refund will be given if canceled before May 26, 2023, and a partial refund of \$10 if before June 2, 2023. Those seeking a "special financial hardship scholarship" must e-mail sshaw@oregoncs.org or call 419-698-7186. Make your check payable to the "City of Oregon" and send it in with the completed registration form to Oregon Police Division/Safety Town, 5330 Seaman Rd., Oregon, Ohio 43616. About 4-H Camp Palmer...

4-H Camp Palmer, located in Fulton County, near Fayette, Ohio. The camp's 157 acres are adjacent to Harrison Lake State Park.

4-H Camp Palmer is privately owned by 4-H members in 11 Northwestern Ohio counties and has a proud heritage and tradition of wholesome educational and recreational activities.

Campers live in cabins near the central area of camp. Each camper has their own bunk and area for personal belongings. Each cabin has well-trained camp counselors. Friends may request to stay in the same cabin. Home-style meals are served in the dining hall. There meals and an evening snack are the tradition at camp.

All camp activities are held in various facilities, including the Craft Hall, Nature Lab, multipurpose Recreation Hall, Adirondack shelter and Dining Hall. Recreational activities take place on the sports field, sand volleyball court, tennis court, basketball court, miniature golf course and archery range. Campers swim in the Olympic-sized pool.

Challenge by Choice Course:

In 1990, 4-H Camp Palmer added an exciting, new, outdoor adventure challenge course. All campers will have the opportunity to participate in the Challenge by Choice Course, also known as Team Building!
The adventure challenge course is perhaps one of the most effective methods in helping campers increase self-confidence, develop leadership skills, discover the power of group cooperation, and learn how to view obstacles as opportunities for growth. The course consists of two parts; an on-the-ground low-balance, trust, and initiative problem solving course.

High Ropes Course:

The high ropes course is a series of aerial log, rope, and cable obstacles 20 feet off the ground. Campers participating on the high elements are at all times "on belay", a safety in-system utilizing ropes and cables. Under the supervision of properly trained instructors, this system provides a safe and challenging experience for each camper. Because of the design of the high ropes course, participation in this activity must be limited to campers 4'10" and taller. This is a 4-hour experience.

Guidelines: Because of the design of the high ropes course, participation in this activity must be limited to campers who meet the following guidelines:
1) Must be 12yo or older.
2) Need to be able to reach the cables, which are approximately 6' 2".
