Excitement is in the air as we gear up for a celestial marvel - the upcoming solar eclipse on **April 8, 2024!** This cosmic event provides a fantastic opportunity for families to come together and explore the wonders of the universe. Here's a brief guide to help you make the most of this unique experience:

**Solar Eclipse Details:**

April 8, 2024

\*Totality expected - 3:12 pm\*

**What is the Solar Eclipse?**

A solar eclipse happens when the moon passes between the sun and the Earth, casting a shadow and momentarily blocking out the sun's light. It's a mesmerizing event that provides a chance for our students to witness the marvels of astronomy firsthand.

**How can I celebrate?**

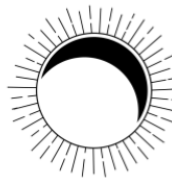
To enhance your family's eclipse experience, here are some suggested activities:

- Watch a video explaining the science <https://science.nasa.gov/eclipses>
- Try a STEM activity as a family like **use a pinhole camera with adult supervision!**
- Host a viewing party the day of the event
- Check out local events and citizen science opportunities for a shared cosmic experience with your community.

**What is my child doing at school?**

To celebrate this exciting event, we have been learning about space, what happens during an eclipse, how to keep our eyes safe, looking through telescopes, and **making an eclipse viewer to use at home with adult supervision.**

**Total and Partial Solar Eclipse Visibility**  
The total eclipse will only be visible over a path ~110 miles wide, but all of the continental U.S. will see a partial eclipse. The total eclipse path crosses the U.S. in southwest Texas and moves northeastward, leaving the U.S. at the Gulf of Maine.

**The 2024 Total Eclipse**

A partial eclipse of the Sun will be visible in all parts of North America on April 8, 2024, but only those on a narrow path will see a total eclipse. During a total eclipse the Sun is completely hidden by the Moon and the sky becomes dark, making for an eerie "night in the middle of the day."

**How Can I Observe the Sun Safely?**

Whenever any part of the Sun is showing it is important to use solar-viewing glasses or to project an image of the Sun to see the beautiful corona. **They are ONLY safe to look directly at the Sun without any viewing devices.**

**Solar-Viewing Glasses**

Regular sunglasses, swimming goggles, and camera filters are **NOT** safe for looking directly at the Sun. You can safely protect your eyes with certified solar-viewing glasses from your library or another reliable institution (such as a local science museum or college/high-school science department). Make sure that on the back, in small print, they say that they are ISO 12312-2 certified.

**Project an image**

Stand with your back to the Sun and use a colander or a piece of cardboard with a small hole in it to project images of the eclipsed Sun on any light-colored surface.

**Experience a Solar Eclipse**

**WHAT IS A SOLAR ECLIPSE?**  
A solar eclipse happens when the Moon moves between the Sun and Earth, casting a shadow on Earth. Only a narrow path across the Earth can see the total eclipse. The rest of the world can see a partial eclipse.

**HOW TO WATCH**  
Use certified solar-viewing glasses or a pinhole camera to project an image of the Sun on a light-colored surface. **Never look directly at the Sun without proper eye protection.**

**HOW LONG WILL IT LAST?**  
The total eclipse will last for a few minutes, depending on your location.

**SAFETY**  
Regular sunglasses, swimming goggles, and camera filters are **NOT** safe for looking directly at the Sun.

**PROJECT AN IMAGE**  
Stand with your back to the Sun and use a colander or a piece of cardboard with a small hole in it to project images of the eclipsed Sun on any light-colored surface.

**SAFETY**  
Regular sunglasses, swimming goggles, and camera filters are **NOT** safe for looking directly at the Sun.

# SAFELY observing THE SUN

**WARNING!** Never look directly at the Sun without proper eye protection. You can seriously injure your eyes.

Check with local science museums, schools and astronomy clubs for eclipse glasses—or purchase an ISO 12312-2 compliant pair of these special shades. Always inspect your solar filter before use. If scratched or damaged, discard it.

**YES** View the eclipse with special eclipse glasses. **NO!** Regular sunglasses are not safe to view the eclipse.

**BUILD A SOLAR VIEWER**  
Create an inexpensive but functional, safe solar viewer with just plywood, lenses, rubber bands, paper and popsicle sticks! <https://go.nasa.gov/3ynAGT>

**MAKE YOUR OWN ECLIPSE PROJECTOR**  
You can make this simple eclipse projector with almost any cardboard box, paper, tape and foil. The longer the distance from the pinhole to screen, the larger the image of the Sun will be. **NEVER look directly at the Sun without appropriate eye-wear!**

**ECLIPSES IN THE UNITED STATES:** The next solar eclipses that cross the United States are on Saturday, October 14, 2023 (Annular Solar Eclipse) and Monday, April 8, 2024 (Total Solar Eclipse).

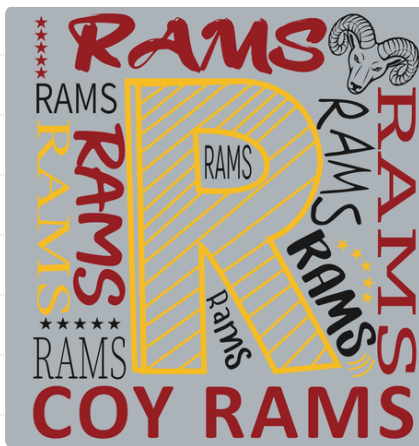

**2024 Oregon Safety Town Registration**



SAFETY TOWN is an organized safety education program for children entering kindergarten from Oregon and the surrounding communities. Safety awareness is taught and practiced in SAFETY TOWN, a city built to a child's scale. Teachers, police, and fire personnel, with the assistance of teenage volunteers, will cover topics such as pedestrians, motorists, buses, railroads, water, and various other safety-related issues. Movies, songs, games, and practice inside SAFETY TOWN will complement the daily classroom activities. Each session is five days (see below for times). All children must be potty-trained.

The Oregonian Club sponsors SAFETY TOWN in cooperation with the City of Oregon's Police and Fire Departments and the Oregon City Schools. SAFETY TOWN is at 3230 Starr Avenue (Starr Elementary School) and offers two sessions—a limit of 60 students per session.

Session 1: June 3rd – 7th (8:00 am – 11:30 am), with Graduation on June 7th at 10:30 am  
Session 2: June 10th – 14th (8:00 am – 11:30 am), with Graduation on June 14th at 10:30 am

A \$30 registration fee must be paid before May 19, 2023. A full refund will be given if canceled before May 26, 2023, and a partial refund of \$10 if before June 2, 2023. Those seeking a "special financial hardship scholarship" must e-mail sshaw@oregoncs.org or call 419-698-7186. Make your check payable to the "City of Oregon" and send it in with the completed registration form to Oregon Police Division/Safety Town, 5330 Seaman Rd., Oregon, Ohio 43616. Payment/registration can be dropped off at the Oregon Police Division's Main Lobby with an envelope marked "Oregon Police Safety Town. Payment and registration may also be submitted to the Coy, Starr, or Jerusalem Elementary school offices.
