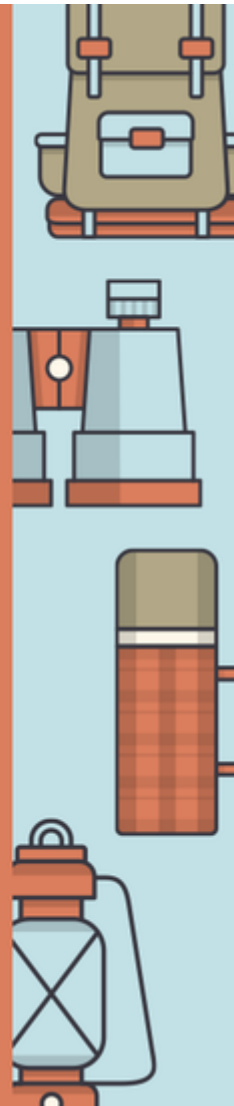

OCS STEM Academy – Coy Grade 4



Oregon City Schools STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math) Academy is offering an opportunity for fourth grade students to participate in after-school STEM activities. Lego Education WeDo 2.0 kits and activities will be used during this session, with students collaborating to complete various projects. Students will learn basic block programming, going beyond just building things with Lego bricks.

Requirements for this program include the ability to work well with others, the desire to learn basic programming skills, and the availability to come to all or nearly all sessions.

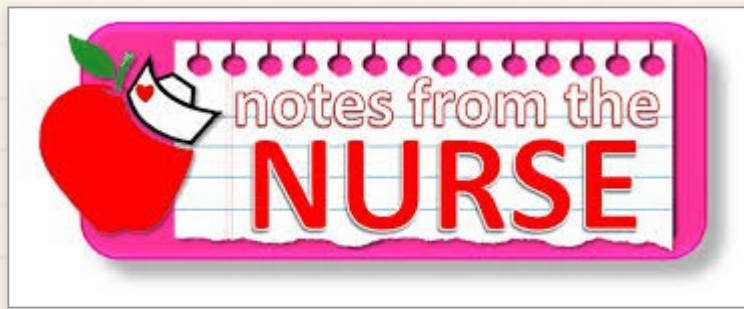

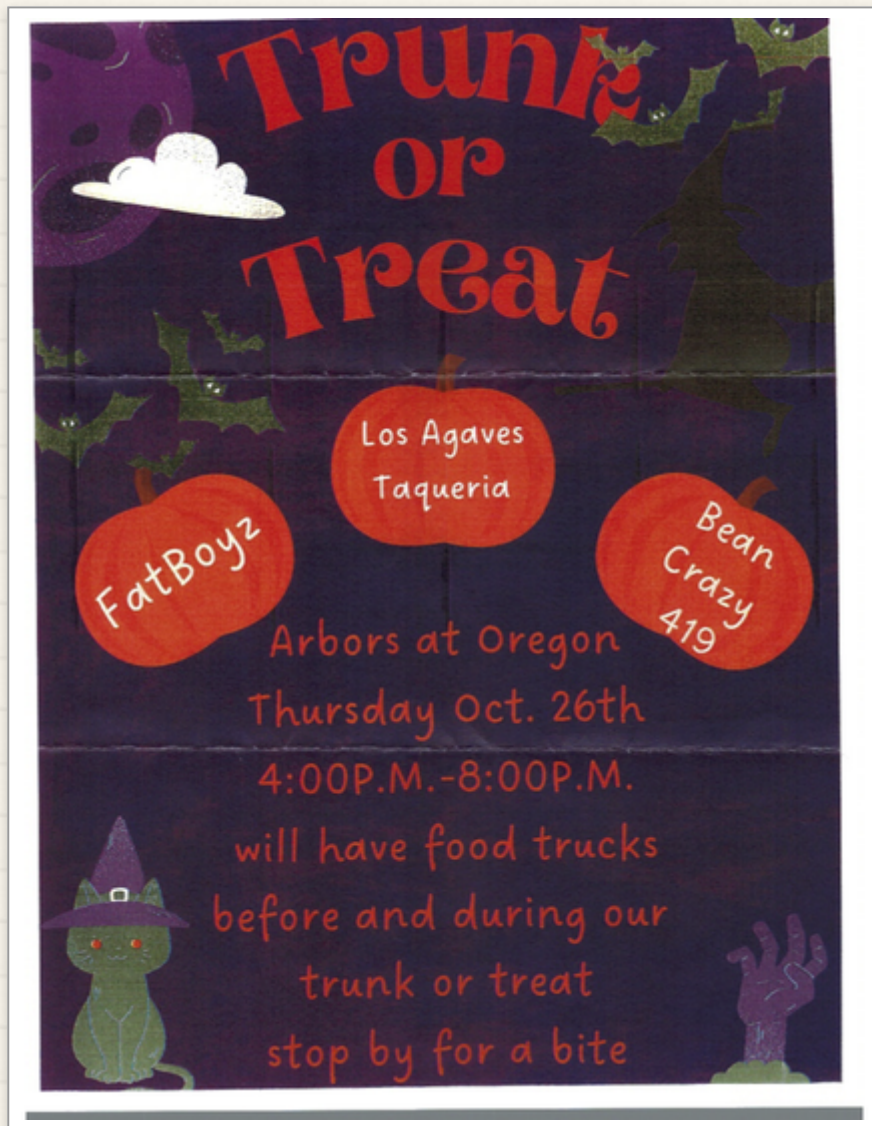

HISTORY

William P. Coontz Complex

Dedicated in 1993 for William P. Coontz, the first recreation director in the City of Oregon.
