I am nominating Dean Davis for the Clay High School Distinguished Hall of Fame. As an artist, after years of grinding, he was able to quit his railroad job and focus on his artistry. He has quickly become the best artist in NW Ohio, and easily best artist to come out of Clay High School. His more recent claim to fame was being the crew lead artist on the Glass City River wall (grain silos along the river), bring lots of positive publicity to the area and always spotlighting Clay High School as where he started his journey.

Though his company Art Farm LLC, he has become a staple of decorating and designing the landscape of Toledo by painting murals all over the city in parks, on overpasses, and all over them having a higher meaning of positivity as well as an educational component. His work has blossomed and taken him to other cities like New Washington, OH and Bloomville, OH where he has painted murals for veterans in those cities. Not only is Dean's work famous on Ohio, but he has recently been flown to Ft. Lauderdale, Florida to do work for the city on a community art installment for veterans.

Since 2021, he has completed and sold over 650 painting for local and national interest and completed over 130 murals. He painted the "Helping Hands of Mercy" in the outside café area of Mercy St. Charles Hospital to provide them with a relaxing place to relax and unwind from the stressful work of being a healthcare worker. Dean is also working with Oregon Schools to repurpose covid barriers that were used in the school during covid and create artwork with the student's involvement thru the Oregon Schools foundation.

Dean continually gives back to his community by offering art classes to Oregon's "Paint Your Voice" charity program as well as being a volunteer art teacher for the juvenile court program in Toledo.

Dean is a mentor and role model for many, and Oregon City Schools and Clay High School should be honored to add Dean Davis to its Distinguished Hall of Fame as the most prolific and accomplished artist to graduate from Clay.

Since 1996, Dean Davis has worked with a wide variety of mediums and has excelled in airbrushing, tattooing and graphic media. Dean has spent many long days in local shops, bars, restaurants, gyms, churches, schools, barns etc., applying beauty through the strokes of his paintbrush and the waves of his spray paints. For 16 years, he honed his gift during his very minimal free time from his railroad employment, and was recently able to retire from the railroad to work full-time as an artist due to his passion, tenacity and determination. Dean spends most of his time on projects in the communities around him, but he also works from his home studio, where he not only hand-stretches his own canvases for private custom painting orders, but also welcomes a plethora of various items from clients to customize for them, from hockey helmets to motorcycles to children's sneakers. Dean has, many times over, donated his studio time and talent at no cost when he learned that the recipient of the order was a child. His LLC, Art Farm, is a for-profit company; however, from the outside looking in, one could very easily assume it to be a non-profit company considering how many projects leave his hands empty, without any reimbursement other than the personal fulfillment Dean achieves through this professional altruism. The entirety of his career as an artist consistently manifests his passion for bettering his community through its children, or as he calls them, "the reason why."
