Connections is About Making Connections!

As you know, your student attends a Connections class on Mondays and Tuesdays and another class on Thursdays and Fridays.

Students can choose Band and/or Choir during that time. Others are assigned extra help (Response to Intervention) in ELA or Math. All others are divided among classes our teachers develop and teach.

The goal of Connections is to give students something that they do not get in the regular curriculum and to allow them to connect to both ideas and to each other.

One class that is taught is Book Club. In the picture below, Fifth graders in Book Club are making connections to a character in their book by imitating Italian artist Michelangelo. Students are simulating the challenges he faced painting the ceiling of the Sistine Chapel as they draw and color pictures taped to the bottom of their desks.




