Storytelling is a great way to promote literacy and build familiar bonds. Parents, share with your children what weekend mornings were like when you were their age. What traditions did you and your family uphold? Ask your child to retell your family memories.	Be word collectors! Collect 10 new or interesting vocabulary words as you hear or read them this week. Write them down and post them where you will see them this week. Try to use them in sentences out loud together.	Our days get busy, and sometimes we forget to say "thank you" to the people who make our lives so very special. For each person in your family, make a list in words and/or pictures of three reasons you are thankful for them. Hang your lists up for everyone to see.				
Parent, ask your child what he or she is reading at school. Encourage him or her to share details including the characters, setting, conflict, and message of the book or story. Discuss books or stories you remember reading from your childhood and what you learned from them.	Read (or create) a picture book, graphic novel or comic book together. Picture books help children develop critical thinking skills as their brains take in the picture and the text and make connections between the two.	Start a story together as a family. One person starts the story and tells one to three sentences. Then the next person takes over and adds the next one to three sentences. See how everyone weaves their own interests and imagination into the plot	Fun with Family History. Did Great Grandpa fight in a World War? Was yo grandma born in a different country? Write or talk about an important event your family's history. Knowing where y came from is important to gaining a strong sense of identity.			
Discuss: Imagine that you were going on vacation, instead of school or work. Where would you go? How long would you stay? What is the weather like and what will you do? What should you pack? This is a great way to practice giving descriptions and making smart decisions.	Share stories about what your school days were like and compare your experience with everyone in your family. We think you'll find the learning process and in-school gadgets have changed quite a bit over the years.	Together, write a letter, email, or text to a faraway friend or family member. Talk about what you might say or which fond memories you may share with the recipient.	Unplug! Set aside time when all screens are off. Everyone grab a book and read! Discuss what each person is reading.
