## The Muddy Eagle



Dear Parents and Guardians,

A signature event at Eisenhower Intermediate School is the Muddy Eagle which we try to hold every other year so students can have the experience once in their two years here!

The focus of the Muddy Eagle is to give our students the opportunity to celebrate health, each other, and our like community through participating in a mile and a half course at the back of the school. The course has mud obstacles, a wall to climb, monkey bars, and other assorted activities. Students can choose to avoid mud if they would like to and can dive in deep if they choose!

Here are some answers to typical questions:

**Is there a cost for students?**

- If a student would like a Muddy Eagle T-shirt, the cost is \$10 (more if they need an Adult 2XL or larger).
- Otherwise, there is no cost.

**Can parents attend?**

- Yes through the attached registration form. There is a cost for this, please see the form. Parents can also volunteer. Parents who do not register cannot be on the course during the race.

**What does a student need to turn in by April 24th?**

- The registration form that will allow us to know if a t-shirt is being ordered and if parents are attending
- The medical waiver form for the student
- The medical waiver form for the parent(s) (if applicable)
- Payment for t-shirts (if applicable)
- Payment for parent registration (if applicable)

**What happens if my student does not want to participate?**

- He or she should still have the waiver signed and he/she can walk the course with a teacher or friends, be outside near the finish line, etc.
- If the waiver is not signed, the student will stay inside in the Testing Center while his/her group is outside.

### What should students bring on race day?

- Plastic bag that includes:
  - Either a change of clothes for after the race (socks, underwear, shorts, t-shirt, shoes) or race clothes.
  - Towel
  - These bags will be stored in lockers and then taken to the staging area before the race.
  - Please be sure to have students wear old shoes that can be caked with mud.

### What happens after the race?

- Students taking the bus home, will be washed off with outside water and then be guided to pick up their bags and go into the locker rooms to change.
- There is an early sign-out procedure. Please see attached form.

### Where should parents who are running go?

- Park on the southside of the school and register at the table in the back of the school 20 mins. before you run. Bring change of clothes and towel. We have a tent for you to change and you can use the outside Porta-potty. Parents cannot go into the school building. If you are picking up your child, please check in the registration table for instructions.
