

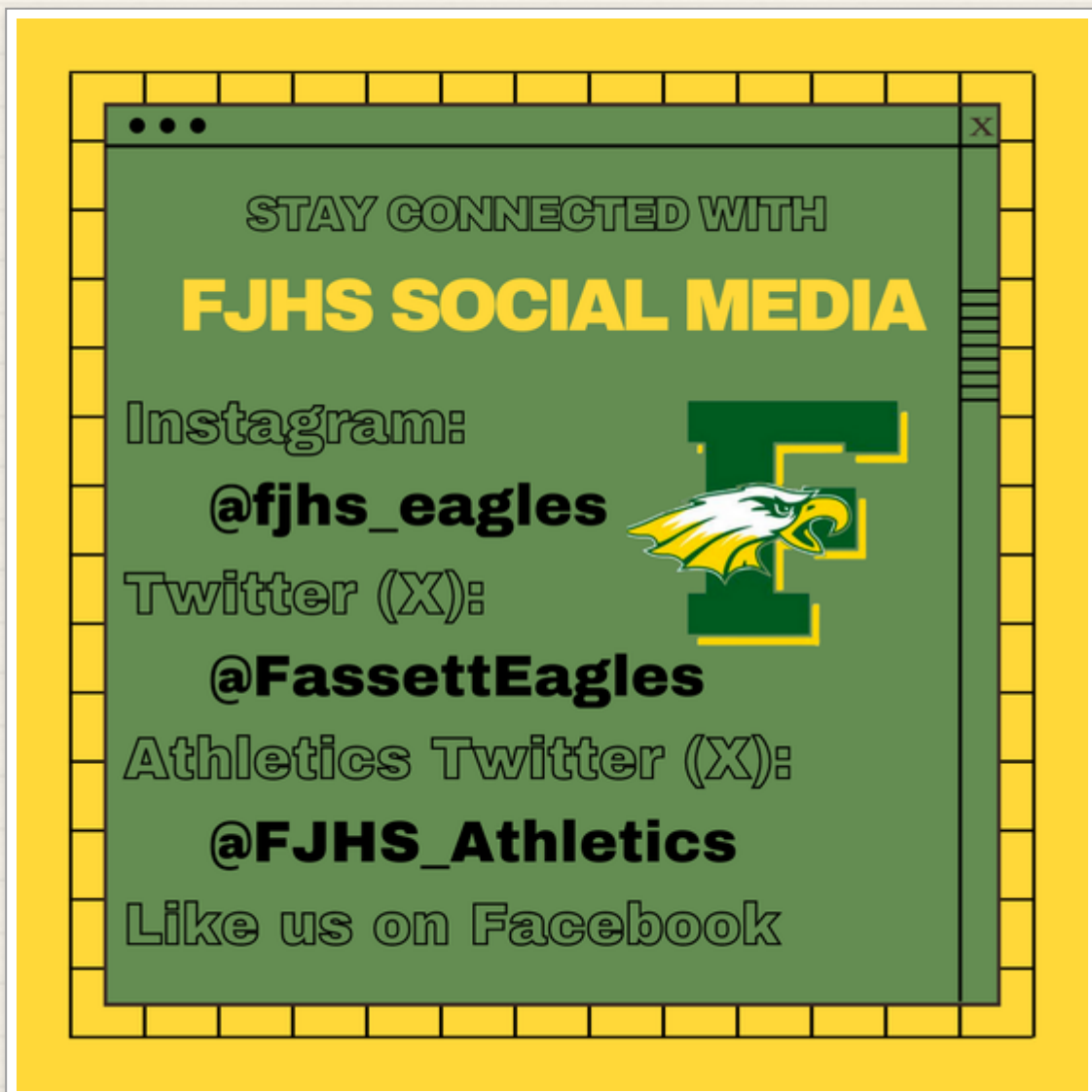

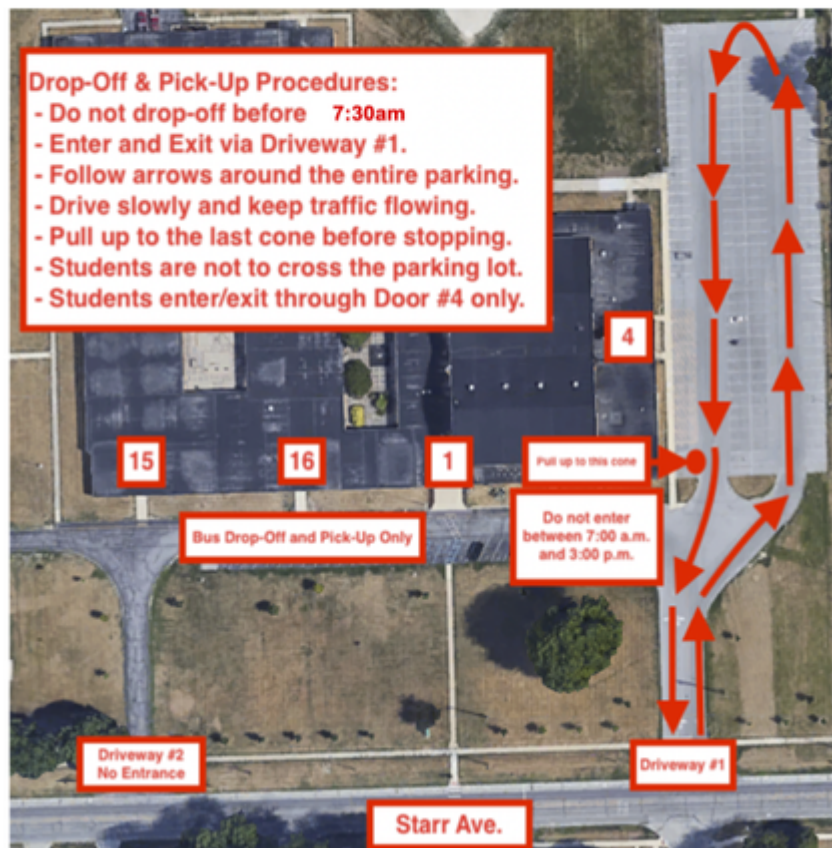

Parents are encouraged to make an appointment **now** with their child's doctor or visit a Shots 4 Tots n Teens immunization clinic.

Ohio School Vaccination Requirements include a Tdap vaccine booster shot and a Meningitis shot for all children entering the 7th grade.

Please plan now to make sure that your child is up-to-date.

Required Vaccinations:

Tdap Booster --protects against Tetanus, Diphtheria, and Pertussis (Whooping Cough)

Meningitis Vaccine—protects against bacterial meningitis

They are recommended to be given at age 11 –12 years.

Recommended Vaccinations:

- HPV (Human Papillomavirus) — protects against cervical cancer in girls and genital warts in boys
- Varicella Booster — protects against Chickenpox. A booster dose is now recommended if child has received only 1 previous dose

When a student misses 4 days a month..

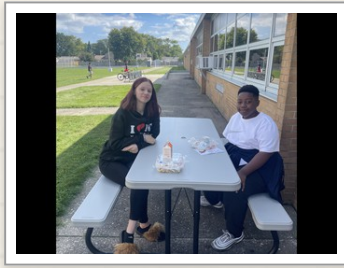

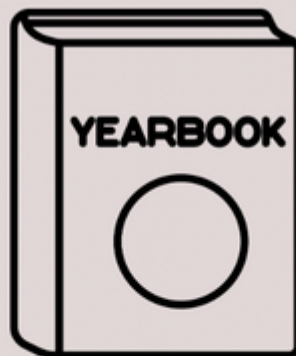

Route: 10:00 am those participating in the cruise will meet at Clay High School (off stadium, near the tennis courts). At 10:30 am a parade of vehicles will turn right out of the school parking lot onto N. Stadium Rd. and proceed southbound to the Seaman Rd. intersection. The cruisers will make a left turn onto Seaman Rd. and proceed eastbound. At Norden Rd. intersection, all vehicles in procession will make a left turn and proceed northbound on N. Norden Rd. The parade will continue northbound on Norden Rd., before entering Maumee Bay State Park at Cedar Point Rd.

This year we will have a "much shorter" cruise through Maumee Bay State Park, before exiting the park at N. Curtice Rd. The cruise will proceed southbound on N. Curtice Rd. to Seaman Rd. intersection. The procession will turn left on Seaman Rd. (eastbound) to the Teachout Rd. intersection. The cruisers will then turn right onto Teachout Rd. (southbound), and then a "quick right" onto Sacks Rd. at the intersection. All vehicles will enter the clearly marked Jerusalem Township Recreation Center, which is located on the left (south side of the road). There will be parking attendants inside this location to direct you.. Thanks for joining us for a very exciting day!

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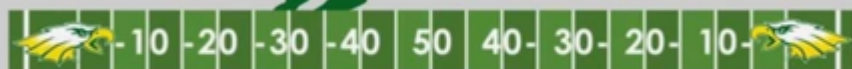

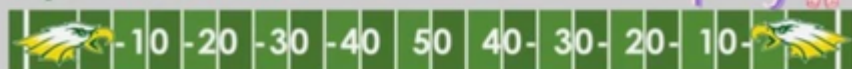

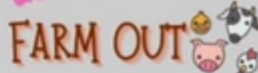

IMPORTANT INFORMATION AND PROCEDURES

Agenda Books: All students will be issued an agenda book. Students are required to carry their agenda book with them at all times throughout the school day. Students will only be issued a hall pass using their own agenda book. If your child loses their agenda book, replacement agenda books will be \$5.00 and charged to the student's account.

Attendance: Please contact the Fassett Attendance Hotline at **419-697-9911** if your child will be absent from school, or if they are in need of an early dismissal due to a medical appointment or family emergency. A medical note is required for an excused absence from school. Notes must be sent to school with students or sent by email within 72 hours from returning to school in order for the absence to be excused.

Bell Schedule: Please review the 2023-24 Bell Schedule on page 24 of the [FJHS 2023-24 Handbook](#), as there have been changes from the previous year.

Bookbags: Students are **NOT** permitted to carry their bookbags back and forth to their classes throughout the school day. Bookbags will be permitted in Homeroom classes **ONLY**, upon arrival to school. However, from 1st period on, bookbags will **NOT** be permitted in the classroom and will need to be placed in their locker. Students should carry their Chrome Book, agenda book and other supplies to each class and stop by their locker only when needed between classes.

Breakfast and Lunch: Please note that the federal program that brought free meals for all students during the pandemic has been discontinued. Fassett Junior High School offers healthy meals each school day.

- Breakfast costs \$2.00 and Lunch costs \$3.00. Milk is \$0.50. Reduced pricing for Breakfast and Lunch is free.

Parents who do not have bank access or limited access may make check payments at the student's school with the secretary. No checks will be accepted from students.

Chromebook information:

The District Technology Damage/Loss/Theft Agreement applies to all 5-12 Students. There is no annual cost to the Student to receive and/or take their device home on a daily basis and all Students are automatically "Opted In" to this process. Students are ONLY responsible for charges incurred due to any damage/loss/theft of a device that has been issued to the Student. The Student will incur the full charge for any such damage/loss/theft as detailed below. Charges are subject to change based on current cost of replacement part/device/charger/case. Drop-Off (Morning) and Pick-Up (Afternoon): Student safety is our top priority. To ensure the safety of our students, as well as an effective and efficient progress for everyone, if you drop-off and/or pick-up your students from FJHS, please follow the route outlined in the attached map below. Please adhere to the drop-off and pick-up times outlined above. If you need to pick your child up early from school, please bring a photo ID. Thank you for your cooperation and understanding with these procedures.

Electronic Devices: Students are permitted to bring their personal electronic device (i.e., cell phone) to school but may only use them for valid educational purposes outlined on page 12 in the [FJHS 2023-24 Handbook](#). Students are highly encouraged to lock their personal electronic device in their locker. Students are not permitted to use their personal electronic device in the classroom, unless the teacher has given students direct permission to do so. If a student enters the classroom with their personal electronic device, they are required to place their device in a provided pocket chart. - Through fun and friendly competitions and events, and positive behavior, Houses will accumulate points throughout the year, with incentive on a monthly and quarterly basis.
- High Five cards are given to students, by staff members, to acknowledge Respectful, Responsible, and Ready behavior. High Five cards earned by students will contribute to the point total for their House.
- Once a month, Houses will meet for a House meetings in the auditorium.
- Once a month we will hold an All-House meeting. These uplifting assemblies/pep rallies will be held to announce students of the month, update students on House points, and possibly give away prizes.

WE ARE COMMITTED TO PROTECTING THE PRIVACY OF YOUR HEALTH INFORMATION. THIS NOTICE DESCRIBES HOW MEDICAL INFORMATION ABOUT YOU MAY BE USED AND DISCLOSED AND HOW YOU CAN GET ACCESS TO THIS INFORMATION. PLEASE REVIEW IT CAREFULLY.

This Notice of Privacy Practices explains how we may use and disclose your protected health information (PHI) to carry out treatment, payment or health care operations (TPO) and for other purposes that are permitted or required by law. It also describes your rights to access and control your protected health information. "Protected health information" is information about you, including demographic information, that may identify you and that relates to your past, present or future physical or mental health condition and related health care services.

USES AND DISCLOSURES OF PROTECTED HEALTH INFORMATION

Your protected health information may be used and disclosed by your care provider or HPWO Pharmacy, our office staff and others outside of our office that are involved in your care and treatment for the purpose of providing health care services to you, to pay your health care bills, to support the operation of the care provider or HPWO Pharmacy, and any other use required by law.

Treatment: We will use and disclose your protected health information to provide, coordinate, or manage your health care and any related services. This includes the coordination or management of your health care with a third party. For example, your protected health information may be provided to a physician to whom you have been referred to ensure that the physician has the necessary information to diagnose or treat you.

Payment: Your protected health information will be used, as needed, to obtain payment for your health care services. For example, obtaining approval for a hospital stay may require that your relevant protected health information be disclosed to the health plan to obtain approval for the hospital admission.

Healthcare Operations: We may use or disclose, as-needed, your protected health information in order to support the business activities of your care provider's practice or HPWO Pharmacy. These activities include, but are not limited to, quality assessment, employee review, training of medical students, licensing, fundraising, and conducting or arranging for other business activities. For example, we may disclose your protected health information to medical school students that see patients at our office. In addition, we may use a sign-in sheet at the registration desk where you will be asked to sign your name and indicate your care provider. We may also call you by name in the waiting room when your care provider or pharmacist is ready to see you. We may use or disclose your protected health information, as necessary, to contact you to remind you of your appointment, and inform you about treatment alternatives or other health-related benefits and services that may be of interest to you.

We may use or disclose your protected health information in the following situations without your authorization. These situations include: as required by law, public health issues as required by law, communicable diseases, health coverage, abuse or neglect, food and drug administration requirements, legal proceedings, law enforcement, coroners, funeral directors, organ donation, research, criminal activity, military activity and national security, workers' compensation, inmates, and other required uses and disclosures. Under the law, we must make disclosures to you upon your request. Under the law, we must also disclose your protected health information when required by the Secretary of the Department of Health and Human Services to investigate or determine our compliance with the requirements under Section 164.506.

Other Permitted and Required Uses and Disclosures will be made only with your consent, authorization or opportunity to object unless required by law. You may revoke the authorization, at any time, in writing, except to the extent that your care provider's practice or HPWO Pharmacy has taken an action in reliance on the use or disclosure indicated in the authorization.

YOUR RIGHTS

The following are statements of your rights with respect to your protected health information.

You have the right to inspect and copy your protected health information (if it may apply) – Under federal law, however, you may not inspect or copy the following records: Psychotherapy notes, information compiled in reasonable anticipation of, or used in, a civil, criminal, or administrative action or proceeding, protected health information restricted by law, information that is related to medical research in which you have agreed to participate, information whose disclosure may result in harm or injury to you or to another person, or information that was obtained under a promise of confidentiality.

You have the right to request a restriction of your protected health information – This means you may ask us not to use or disclose any part of your protected health information for the purposes of treatment, payment or healthcare operations. You may also request that any part of your protected health information not be disclosed to family members or friends who may be involved in your care or for notification purposes as described in this Notice of Privacy Practices. Your request must state the specific restriction requested and to whom you want the restriction to apply. Your physician is not required to agree to your requested restriction.

You have the right to request to receive confidential communications – You have the right to request confidential communication from us by alternative means or at an alternative location. You have the right to obtain a paper copy of this notice from us, upon request, even if you have agreed to accept this notice alternatively i.e. electronically.

You have the right to request an amendment to your protected health information – If we deny your request for amendment, you have the right to file a statement of disagreement with us and we may prepare a rebuttal to your statement and will provide you with a copy of any such rebuttal.

You have the right to receive an accounting of certain disclosures – You have the right to receive an accounting of all disclosures except for disclosures: pursuant to an authorization, for purposes of treatment, payment, healthcare operations, required by law, that occurred prior to April 14, 2003, or six years prior to the date of this request.

You have the right to obtain a paper copy of this notice from us even if you have agreed to receive the notice electronically. We reserve the right to change the terms of this notice and to make new notice revisions effective for all protected health information that we maintain by:

- Posting the revised notice at our facilities
- Making copies of the revised notice available upon request

Silver Diamine Fluoride (SDF) – A new dental treatment to fight cavities

Dental cavities are very common with children, but now our outreach dental teams have a safe, painless alternative to traditional cavity drilling procedures called silver diamine fluoride (SDF). SDF is an FDA-approved antibiotic liquid used to help prevent cavities from forming, growing, or spreading to other teeth. It is simply brushed on the tooth.

About SDF:

- The outreach dental team will use SDF on back teeth only.
- It's normal for SDF to stain the cavity brown or black. This is permanent but can be reversed with a filling or loss of the baby tooth.
- The healthy parts of the tooth will not be stained.
- Further treatment of any dental care needs can be met at our health centers. SDF treatment may not eliminate the need for a traditional filling.
- SDF can temporarily stain nearby areas in the mouth. The stain causes no harm and should disappear on its own within a few days to a couple of weeks.
- SDF may cause a temporary metallic taste.
