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NEW INFORMATION:

Assignments/Learning on Hybrid Non-Attendance Days: parents/guardians, please strongly encourage and support the completion of assignments when students are not in-person during Hybrid Learning. Although students are not attending live instruction, teachers are providing students assignments via Schoology, which may include recorded session of instruction. Assignments not only are required to be completed, but also prepare students for instruction taking place during days of attendance. Failure to complete assignments results in both an absence and a lack of preparation for in-person learning. Thank you for your continued support!

Emails for Students: parents/guardians, please encourage your child(ren) to check and read their school email on a regular basis (multiple times daily). Email has been a consistent form of communication between students and teachers/staff. The importance of email communication has increased even more with hybrid and remote learning.

Students will not attend in-person each day, but will be expected to be engaged in learning, which could include live Zoom lessons. Fassett teachers will provide specific instructions for students.

College Credit Plus (CCP) Informational Meeting: is your son or daughter interested in participating in the College Credit Plus program for the 2021-22 school year? If the answer is yes, please plan to attend the virtual meeting on Wednesday, February 10, beginning at 6:00 pm. This meeting will cover a variety of topics including the application process, eligibility, pros/cons of CCP and much more. In order for your child to participate in CCP during the 21-22 school year, the parent must "attend" this meeting AND submit the Intent to Participate Form to your child's counselor before May 1, 2021. A link to this meeting will be emailed to all parents on Monday, February 8. If the student is currently enrolled in CCP courses, attendance at this meeting is not necessary. However, anyone planning on taking a CCP course during the 2021-22 school year must submit the Intent to Participate Form before May 1.

Counselor Scheduling Appointments for 8th Graders: scheduling for Clay High School began Monday, February 1st. 8th grade students are meeting with Mr. Maletich to select course requests for Clay. Students will choose; (1) Language Arts, (1) Math, (1) Science and (1) Social Studies class. They will also have (3) periods for electives.
