Throughout the next few months, we will begin the process of planning for next year. This includes assessing our master schedule, the effectiveness of our curricular programs, establishing our staffing needs, and, of course, creating class lists for the 2023-2024 school year.

This process of creating class lists requires time and careful consideration. Initially, your child's teacher will review his/her current class list. During this stage, your child's teacher will indicate the academic and behavioral needs of individual students. This information along with the overall composition of the class is considered in order to make the best possible classroom assignment for each student.

If you feel that a particular learning situation may be more appropriate for your child, you are asked to provide a description of the suggested classroom setting to the building principal so that it can be taken into consideration. Specific teacher requests will not be honored. Parent letters with specific information that may help place a child in the most appropriate setting need to be submitted to the building principal by the end of April.

Class balance is extremely important for the success of all our students. Rosters are composed with consideration to each individual's learning style, peer relationships, gender ratio, disciplinary concerns, and the academic needs of all our students. We appreciate you placing trust in the professionals who work with your children on a daily basis in the learning environment.



SAFETY UPDATES FROM OFFICER JEFF:

I would like our parents to know we have completed our gun safety talk on Wednesday, April 19, 2023 with the entire school. I would encourage parents to talk with their kids about firearms, since most of our students indicated they have them inside their households. If the parents have firearms inside their households, I would ask them to be a responsible gun owner and keep all firearms secured with a gun lock, or locked up in a gun safe. If parents have any gun related questions, feel free to contact me. Gun violence continues to escalate in our country, now being the leading cause of death among teenagers. Accidental shootings with younger children are also on the rise, now that the sale of firearms continues to increase.

Thank you, Officer Jeff Spring has sprung and so have many of the allergens! I am still getting reports of positive strep throat and pinkeye. If your student is diagnosed with either of these they must be on the antibiotic for 24 hrs before returning to school with a doctor's note. Enjoy your weekend!

CLASSDOJO:

ClassDojo is a communication app for the classroom. It connects teachers, parents, and students who use it to share photos, videos, and messages through the school day. They use ClassDojo to work together as a team, share in the classroom experience, and bring big ideas to life in their classrooms and homes. Jerusalem teachers may be using ClassDojo in a variety of ways within their classroom throughout the school year. Not all teachers are currently using this tool within their classroom at this time, as it is their choice. Some teachers will continue to communicate with parents through email, phone, newsletters, etc. However, we encourage you to sign up for ClassDojo to receive important building updates/messages from Mr. Straka. Information on signing up for ClassDojo will be sent home from your child's teacher.

FROM THE OFFICE:

Parent pickup at the end of the day. All calls should be made by 3:00 and no later. This will give the teacher time to check messages and drastically reduce the possibility of the student being in the wrong line. Thank you for your understanding.

DELIVERIES FOR STUDENTS:

Jerusalem Elementary has implemented a system for items to be delivered to students once the day begins. Please leave items on the table outside the office door, complete the delivery log, and notify the secretary of your delivery. Thanks for your cooperation!

SCHOOL SUPPLIES:

This year, we have decided to purchase a variety of school supplies for each classroom to start the year. This allowed us to decrease the number of items that parents are responsible for purchasing. If you are in need of school supplies, please let us know. We can help!

MORNING DROP-OFF ROUTINE:

Please see the following important information involving the morning drop-off routine for students. Students will not be permitted to enter the building until **8:50 am**. Please do not let your child(ren) exit the vehicle until the main entrance doors are opened. Thanks for your cooperation!

- Please drive **slowly**.
- Please drop off your student(s) between the Safety Markers (plastic figures with flags).
 Do not drop off outside of this zone. Pull all the way down to the last Safety Marker to allow multiple cars to unload at the same time.
- Please stay in the car drop-off line until your child(ren) exits the vehicle. Do not drive around other vehicles to move ahead in line, or to exit the lot.
- Please have any and all children in your vehicle exit on the building/driver side of the vehicle.
- **Do not park in the drop off line.** We need to keep the traffic moving. It is preferred that students are dropped off in the identified zone, rather than walked into the building. If you need to enter the building for an appointment you must park your vehicle in a parking space, and carefully walk your child(ren) into the building.

Thank you for following these procedures, as we all work together to make the arrival process safe for students, parents, and staff.

NEW PARENT PICK UP CARDS:

We are issuing NEW Parent Pick Up Cards this year. If you plan on picking up your child(ren) from school, please see Mrs. Freimark in the office for a new set of Parent Pick Up Cards. These will be a different color from our old cards. If you still have your old cards, please return them to the office to avoid being charged for them.

STUDENT DISMISSAL:

To help with the flow of traffic, parent pick-up students will be dismissed to the main entrance beginning at 3:30 pm. Please be sure to have your pick-up card out, and your child(ren)'s card attached to their book bag in a visible location. Parents should wait inside the foyer, or just outside the doors while waiting for their child(ren). Please be patient with this process. If you don't have a parent pick-up card you will be asked to enter the office and provide your ID.

Pick up cards will be available to be signed out starting Monday, August 22nd. Please stop in the office to pick up your cards.

GRADE LEVEL AND TEAM UPDATES:

Kindergarten- There is a lot going on with Kindergarten! Our field trip to Pearson Park, and Clay High School is on Monday May 1, please send in the permission slip if you have not already. Our ABC countdown has started, and this week we have Monday C-Craft day, Tuesday D-drawing day, Wednesday E- experiment day, Thursday F-favorite book day (don't forget to send in your favorite book!) and Friday G- game day. Our Kindergarten concert is coming up on May 18th. For reading this is our last week with new words! Our words this week are come, may, part. In math we continue to work on addition and subtraction. Keep reading for the April reading calendar. The school year is going fast and there is lots going on so please make sure to check Class Dojo regularly for updates.

1st Grade- Next week in ELA, we will read the story *Farfallina and Marcel* by Holly Keller, along with stories from our Wonders Reading Series that focus on butterflies and life cycles. The students will learn about characters and their actions; dialogue and why quotation marks are used in a text; retelling the events of a story; practicing contractions; reviewing rhyming words; and learning about the life cycle of a butterfly and the life cycles of other animals/creatures. In Spelling, the students will focus on reviewing vowel team words with -ai, -ay, -ea, -ee, -oa and -oe and have their Spelling Test on Friday. In Writing, the students will be writing about the life cycle of a butterfly. In Math, we will begin Chapter 14 on Fractions and Equal Parts. Thanks for all that you do and have a fantastic weekend!

2nd Grade- The Second Graders have had a busy week preparing for the Wax Museum on April 28th! The students spent time in class practicing their speeches and preparing their display board. Your child should continue to practice their speech at home. Please encourage your child to use appropriate voice volume, good eye contact, and a clear speaking voice when reading their speech. Also, make sure your child has a costume/props ready to bring to school on April 28th. The 2nd Graders are looking forward to sharing their speeches next week at our Wax Museum! Here is the schedule of when each class will give their presentations:

Ostrander: 9:30-10:15a.m., Schultze: 10:30-11:15a.m., Singlar: 1:15-2:00p.m. Thank you to everyone who came to the 2nd Grade Spring Concert on Wednesday. The students did such an amazing job! Have a wonderful weeknend!

3rd Grade- We are very proud of how hard our 3rd graders worked this week on the OST/Reading test! The students enjoyed reading the positive messages from home! Thank you for taking the time to write encouraging notes to your children! We will be taking the 3rd grade OST in Math on Thursday, April 27th and Friday, April 28th in the morning. Please make sure your child is well rested and has a healthy breakfast. In our studies next week, we will continue to learn and research about the Titanic in ELA. Students will be writing research reports on the Titanic over the next few weeks. In Math, we will review previously learned concepts to prepare for the upcoming OST. We will be learning about economics in Social

Studies. Please send in all field trip permission slips and money by May 3rd. Our field trip to Sauder Village is May 18th. Have a great weekend!
