- and Prizes (except shirts) will be sent home on September 29th!










#### **SEPTEMBER READING LOGS:**






## JERUSALEM COMMUNITY CAR SHOW, SUNDAY, SEPTEMBER 24TH

If you would like to join in the parade, or just watch...

**Route:** 10:00 am those participating in the cruise will meet at Clay High School (off stadium, near the tennis courts). At 10:30 am a parade of vehicles will turn right out of the school parking lot onto N. Stadium Rd. and proceed southbound to the Seaman Rd. intersection. The cruisers will make a left turn onto Seaman Rd. and proceed eastbound. At Norden Rd. intersection, all vehicles in procession will make a left turn and proceed northbound on N. Norden Rd. The parade will continue northbound on Norden Rd., before entering Maumee Bay State Park at Cedar Point Rd.

This year we will have a "much shorter" cruise through Maumee Bay State Park, before exiting the park at N. Curtice Rd. The cruise will proceed southbound on N. Curtice Rd. to Seaman Rd. intersection. The procession will turn left on Seaman Rd. (eastbound) to the Teachout Rd. intersection. The cruisers will then turn right onto Teachout Rd. (southbound), and then a "quick right" onto Sacks Rd. at the intersection. All vehicles will enter the clearly marked Jerusalem Township Recreation Center, which is located on the left (south side of the road). #### **CLASSDOJO:**

ClassDojo is a communication app for the classroom. It connects teachers, parents, and students who use it to share photos, videos, and messages through the school day. They use ClassDojo to work together as a team, share in the classroom experience, and bring big ideas to life in their classrooms and homes. Jerusalem teachers may be using ClassDojo in a variety of ways within their classroom throughout the school year. Not all teachers are currently using this tool within their classroom at this time, as it is their choice. Some teachers will continue to communicate with parents through email, phone, newsletters, etc. However, we encourage you to sign up for ClassDojo to receive important building updates/messages from Mr. Straka. Information on signing up for ClassDojo will be sent home from your child's teacher.

#### **CELL PHONES AND OTHER ELECTRONIC DEVICES:**

Just a reminder that all cell phones, smartwatches, and other personal electronic devices must be turned off and placed in the student's lockers upon arriving at school. These devices are often a distraction to students, and are not permitted to be with students during the day. Thanks for your cooperation!

#### FROM THE OFFICE:

Parent pickup at the end of the day. All calls should be made by 3:00 and no later. This will give the teacher time to check messages and drastically reduce the possibility of the student being in the wrong line. Thank you for your understanding.

#### **DELIVERIES FOR STUDENTS:**

Jerusalem Elementary has implemented a system for items to be delivered to students once the day begins. Please leave items on the table outside the office door, complete the delivery log, and notify the secretary of your delivery. Thanks for your cooperation!

#### **SCHOOL SUPPLIES:**

This year, we have decided to purchase a variety of school supplies for each classroom to start the year. This allowed us to decrease the number of items that parents are responsible for purchasing.

#### **MORNING DROP-OFF ROUTINE:**

Please see the following important information involving the morning drop-off routine for students. Students will not be permitted to enter the building until **8:50 am**. Please do not let your child(ren) exit the vehicle until the main entrance doors are opened. Thanks for your cooperation!

- Please drive slowly.
- Please drop off your student(s) between the Safety Markers (plastic figures with flags).
   Do not drop off outside of this zone.
- Please stay in the car drop-off line until your child(ren) exits the vehicle. Do not drive around other vehicles to move ahead in line, or to exit the lot.
- Please have any and all children in your vehicle exit on the building/driver side of the vehicle.
- Do not park in the drop off line. We need to keep the traffic moving. It is preferred that students are dropped off in the identified zone, rather than walked into the building. If you need to enter the building for an appointment you must park your vehicle in a parking space, and carefully walk your child(ren) into the building.

Thank you for following these procedures, as we all work together to make the arrival process safe for students, parents, and staff.

#### **PARENT PICK UP CARDS:**

If you plan on picking up your child(ren) from school, please see Mrs. Freimark in the office for a set of Parent Pick Up Cards unless you have yours from last year.

#### STUDENT DISMISSAL:

To help with the flow of traffic, parent pick-up students will be dismissed to the main entrance beginning at 3:30 pm. Please be sure to have your pick-up card out, and your child(ren)'s card attached to their book bag in a visible location. Please be patient with this process. If you don't have a parent pick-up card, you will be asked to enter the office and provide your ID.

Pick up cards will be available to be signed out on the 17th, 18th and 21st. Please stop in the office.

For your child(ren)'s safety, we will only release students to parents/guardians with matching pick-up cards that are waiting in the lobby.

#### FROM OFFICER JEFF:

Next week on September 6th and 7th, we will be doing bus safety for all of our students. Students will be reminded how to properly load/unload the bus, and they will practice a rear bus evacuation. Be sure to ask them what they learned!

#### **GRADE LEVEL AND TEAM UPDATES:**

**Kindergarten-** Next week we will continue to learn about colors and shapes, as well as introduce the letters Aa and Dd. We continue to work on routines and expectations in the classroom and around the building. Enjoy the long weekend and remember Tuesday is Blue day, Wednesday is Purple Day, Thursday is Pink day and Friday is Tie-Dye Day.

1st Grade- We have had a great full week in 1st grade! We hope you enjoy your long weekend to celebrate Labor Day. When students return to school on Tuesday, we will be focusing on the short a sound in phonics, reading from our Wonders book, the stories "Nat and Sam" and "Jack Can". We'll also read the story Nerdy Birdy by Aaron Reynolds. In math, we will continue chapter 1 on addition and subtraction situations. On Wednesday, students have bus safety and on Friday is our first Focus 3 Family time. Lastly, like last year, students will keep a reading log in their homework folders. Our goal for first grade is to have 20 days of reading colored in! At the end of the month, we will collect them for a reward! Have a great long weekend!

**2nd Grade-** Next week in Language Arts we will continue with our Wonders Series as well as beginning

our unit on Nouns, and continuing to build our "stamina" during our Read to Self Time. In Math we will finish Chapter 1, Numbers and Arrays and begin Chapter 7, Understand Place Value to 1,000. We will also continue practicing addition and subtraction strategies, as well as take our 100 addition and subtraction timed tests. The second grade goal is to complete this test in 5 minutes with 75% accuracy or higher to earn a 4.

The 2nd graders are excited to participate in the "Safety Around Water" swim program at the YMCA, which started this week for Mrs. Ostrander's class. Mrs. Schultze's class and Mrs. Singlar's class will follow in September and October. Please have your child wear a swimsuit **under** their clothing when they come to school. Also, send a towel and underwear for your child to change into after swimming, along with a plastic bag for wet clothes. Please contact your child's teacher with any questions! We hope you have a wonderful long weekend!

**3rd Grade-** It has been an awesome first 2 weeks of school! In our studies next week, we will review all of the strategies for multiplication and apply these to word problems in Math. In ELA, we will finish our novel and wrap up our unit on bullying and friendship. We will continue our focus on map skills in Social Studies. Please remember there is no school on Monday, Sept. 4th due to Labor Day. Have a great long weekend!

**4th Grade-** We had another wonderful week in fourth grade!! We're getting to know each other and starting new topics in all subjects. Reminder: No school on Monday (Labor Day). **Physical Education with Mr. Allen-** Next week in PE, we will start our Jump Rope Ninja testing. We will test how many jumps the kiddos can do in a row without the rope stopping. **STEAM with Mrs. Minnick-** This week in STEAM 1-4 students began to learn about what makes a team work. We practiced teamwork strategies by completing a cup-stacking challenge. The students had to work together to achieve the same goal by communicating directions to each other. It is a hard thing to learn and we are busy practicing! Our kindergarten students finished some really cool art work that we will display in the library. You can check them out at our next parent meeting. Have a great and safe holiday weekend.

**Character Lessons with Mrs. Hower-** I am so excited to start the 23-24 school year! I hope everyone had a wonderful and relaxing summer break. My classroom character lessons will start in September. I will introduce myself to the incoming kindergarten students. September's theme of the month is **RESPECT**, and word of the month is **INTEGRITY**.
