
#### From Mr. Straka:

Jerusalem Community Car Show, Sunday, September 24th

If you would like to join in the parade, or just watch...

**Route:** 10:00 am those participating in the cruise will meet at Clay High School (off stadium, near the tennis courts). At 10:30 am a parade of vehicles will turn right out of the school parking lot onto N. Stadium Rd. and proceed southbound to the Seaman Rd. intersection. The cruisers will make a left turn onto Seaman Rd. and proceed eastbound. At Norden Rd. intersection, all vehicles in procession will make a left turn and proceed northbound on N. Norden Rd. The parade will continue northbound on Norden Rd., before entering Maumee Bay State Park at Cedar Point Rd.

This year we will have a "much shorter" cruise through Maumee Bay State Park, before exiting the park at N. Curtice Rd. The cruise will proceed southbound on N. Curtice Rd. to Seaman Rd. intersection. The procession will turn left on Seaman Rd. (eastbound) to the Teachout Rd. intersection. The cruisers will then turn right onto Teachout Rd. (southbound), and then a "quick right" onto Sacks Rd. at the intersection. All vehicles will enter the clearly marked Jerusalem Township Recreation Center, which is located on the left (south side of the road). There will be parking attendants inside this location to direct you.. Thanks for joining us for a very exciting day!





#### ClassDojo:

ClassDojo is a communication app for the classroom. It connects teachers, parents, and students who use it to share photos, videos, and messages through the school day. They use ClassDojo to work together as a team, share in the classroom experience, and bring big ideas to life in their classrooms and homes. Jerusalem teachers may be using ClassDojo in a variety of ways within their classroom throughout the school year. Not all teachers are currently using this tool within their classroom at this time, as it is their choice. Some teachers will continue to communicate with parents through email, phone, newsletters, etc. However, we encourage you to sign up for ClassDojo to receive important building updates/messages from Mr. Straka. Information on signing up for ClassDojo will be sent home from your child's teacher.

#### Cell Phones and other electronic devices:

Just a reminder that all cell phones, smartwatches, and other personal electronic devices must be turned off and placed in the student's lockers upon arriving at school. These devices are often a distraction to students, and are not permitted to be with students during the day. Thanks for your cooperation!

#### From the Office:

Parent pickup at the end of the day. All calls should be made by 3:00 and no later. This will give the teacher time to check messages and drastically reduce the possibility of the student being in the wrong line. Thank you for your understanding.

#### **Deliveries for Students:**

Jerusalem Elementary has implemented a system for items to be delivered to students once the day begins. Please leave items on the table outside the office door, complete the delivery log, and notify the secretary of your delivery. Thanks for your cooperation!

#### **School Supplies:**

This year, we have decided to purchase a variety of school supplies for each classroom to start the year. This allowed us to decrease the number of items that parents are responsible for purchasing.

#### Morning Drop-Off Routine:

Please see the following important information involving the morning drop-off routine for students.

Students will not be permitted to enter the building until **9:50 am**. Please do not let your child(rep) evit

the vehicle until the main entrance doors are opened. Thanks for your cooperation!

- Please drive slowly.
- Please drop off your student(s) **between** the Safety Markers (plastic figures with flags). Do not drop off outside of this zone.
- Please stay in the car drop-off line until your child(ren) exits the vehicle. Do not drive around other vehicles to move ahead in line, or to exit the lot.
- Please have any and all children in your vehicle exit on the building/driver side of the vehicle.
- **Do not park in the drop off line.** We need to keep the traffic moving. It is preferred that students are dropped off in the identified zone, rather than walked into the building. If you need to enter the building for an appointment you must park your vehicle in a parking space, and carefully walk your child(ren) into the building.

Thank you for following these procedures, as we all work together to make the arrival process safe for students, parents, and staff.

#### Parent Pick Up Cards:

If you plan on picking up your child(ren) from school, please see Mrs. Freimark in the office for a set of Parent Pick Up Cards unless you have yours from last year.

#### Student Dismissal:

To help with the flow of traffic, parent pick-up students will be dismissed to the main entrance beginning at 3:30 pm. Please be sure to have your pick-up card out, and your child(ren)'s card attached to their book bag in a visible location. Please be patient with this process. If you don't have a parent pick-up card, you will be asked to enter the office and provide your ID.

Pick up cards will be available to be signed out on the 17th, 18th and 21st. Please stop in the office.

For your child(ren)'s safety, we will only release students to parents/guardians with matching pickup cards that are waiting in the lobby.

#### From Officer Jeff:

Parents of first, second and fourth grade students please speak with your children regarding bus safety. On Wednesday, September 13th, our Oregon City School Bus Drivers trained our children on how to safely wait for their bus, and how to get off the bus safely. The children were also instructed and then performed the proper way to cross the road in front of the school bus, whether exiting, or boarding their bus. The bus drivers also took time to discuss school bus safety tips, which will help to keep our children safe. If you have any questions regarding this training feel free to contact me. #### Grade Level and Team Updates:

**Kindergarten-** This week the focus will be on the letters LI and Hh. Our first math unit is going quickly and the students are getting good at recognizing and writing numbers 0-5. It was great seeing everyone at muffins with me on Friday, we hope you enjoyed it as much as the students did! Don't forget the Jog-a-thon packets are due on Tuesday September 19 and the event is on Friday September 22, this is our ONLY fundraiser so please think about participating. **1st Grade-** Next week in First Grade, students will practice short u words, like in the word (mud). In our Wonders books, we will explore the stories "3 Little Dassies", "3 Little Pigs", "Cubs in a Hut" and more to help practice reading short u words. Students will also be focusing on fantasy stories this week, as well as writing complete sentences with descriptive details. In math, we will begin Chapter 2: Fluency and Strategies within 10, in our Big Ideas math books. Next week is a 4 day week, there will be a fire drill, Jog-a-Thon is on Friday, and we will have our first Student of the Month pizza party! Please send your child in tennis shoes and with a water bottle on Friday for Jog-a-Thon.

**2nd Grade-** Next week in Language Arts we will read various stories from our Wonders Series. We will begin our Collective Nouns unit in Grammar. In Math, we will finish chapter 7, Numbers to 1,000 and take our summative assessment. Then we will begin Chapter 2, Fluency and Strategies Within 100. Our spelling pattern words next week contain the vowel teams ea, ai, and oa.

The 2nd graders in Mrs. Schultze's class will have their first swim lesson at the YMCA next Friday, September 22!
