

Dear Jerusalem Parents/Guardians:

I hope this letter finds your family enjoying the changing of the season! As Halloween approaches, please reference the following for updates on Halloween-related school activities, as well as guidelines for costumes worn on Halloween.

Halloween Parade: On Tuesday, October 31 we will hold our annual Halloween Parade. The parade will begin at approximately 2:25 p.m., and will last approximately 20 minutes. Students will line up by grade level, and will exit the Northeast doors, indicated on the parade route map (reverse side). Students will parade around the perimeter of the east/back parking lot, by grade-level (oldest to youngest). Parents may line up outside to take pictures and watch the parade, but for safety purposes and due to limited space, <u>CANNOT</u> enter the building. Visitors are asked to stay on the outside perimeter of the parade route. If you have already made arrangements with a classroom teacher to assist with the parade and/or parties, you <u>must</u> check in at the office and wear a visitor pass while at Jerusalem. In case of rain, the parade will be held inside, during which time we ask visitors to enter the main entrance only, and to gather in the gymnasium. To avoid congestion with buses, parents/visitors will need to park along the north end of the parking lot or in the Jerusalem Parks and Recreation parking lot (entrance off Sacks Rd.) and to ensure vehicles are allowing for normal passage of our buses by 3:00 p.m.

Halloween Costumes: Please support the following guidelines to ensure our Halloween activities are both fun and safe for all students. No costumes by adult visitors

- · DO use sound judgment when selecting our costumes.
- · DO NOT wear costumes to school. Students must bring costumes to school.
- . DO NOT wear/apply face paint/make-up, gel, or hair spray prior to arriving at school.
- . DO NOT bring any type of weaponry or anything that resembles weaponry.
- DO NOT wear clothing that could be considered inappropriate (poor taste) for school (Halter tops, showing off the midriff, overly short skirts or shorts).
- DO NOT wear "gory" costumes. Masks are not permitted during the school day or the parade.
- Unless specified by the teacher, assistance will not be needed with student costumes.


Classroom Parties: The decision whether to hold a classroom party is at the discretion of each teacher, and may take place either before or after the parade. Classroom teachers will contact parents/guardians directly if assistance is needed with classroom parties, and will provide the office with the approved list of visitor/helpers.




CANDY CRAWL:





CLASSDOJO:

ClassDojo is a communication app for the classroom. It connects teachers, parents, and students who use it to share photos, videos, and messages through the school day. They use ClassDojo to work together as a team, share in the classroom experience, and bring big ideas to life in their classrooms and homes. Jerusalem teachers may be using ClassDojo in a variety of ways within their classroom throughout the school year. Not all teachers are currently using this tool within their classroom at this time, as it is their choice. Some teachers will continue to communicate with parents through email, phone, newsletters, etc. However, we encourage you to sign up for ClassDojo to receive important building updates/messages from Mr. Straka. Information on signing up for ClassDojo will be sent home from your child's teacher.

CELL PHONES AND OTHER ELECTRONIC DEVICES:

Just a reminder that all cell phones, smartwatches, and other personal electronic devices must be turned off and placed in the student's lockers upon arriving at school. These devices are often a distraction to students, and are not permitted to be with students during the day. Thanks for your cooperation!

FROM THE OFFICE:

Parent pickup at the end of the day. All calls should be made by 3:00 and no later. This will give the teacher time to check messages and drastically reduce the possibility of the student being in the wrong line. Thank you for your understanding.

DELIVERIES FOR STUDENTS:

Jerusalem Elementary has implemented a system for items to be delivered to students once the day begins. Please leave items on the table outside the office door, complete the delivery log, and notify the secretary of your delivery. Thanks for your cooperation!

SCHOOL SUPPLIES:

This year, we have decided to purchase a variety of school supplies for each classroom to start the year. This allowed us to decrease the number of items that parents are responsible for purchasing.

MORNING DROP-OFF ROUTINE:

Please see the following important information involving the morning drop-off routine for students. Students will not be permitted to enter the building until **8:50 am**. Please do not let your child(ren) exit the vehicle until the main entrance doors are opened. Thanks for your cooperation!

- Please drive slowly.
- Please drop off your student(s) between the Safety Markers (plastic figures with flags).
 Do not drop off outside of this zone.
- Please stay in the car drop-off line until your child(ren) exits the vehicle. Do not drive around other vehicles to move ahead in line, or to exit the lot.
- Please have any and all children in your vehicle exit on the building/driver side of the vehicle.
- **Do not park in the drop off line.** We need to keep the traffic moving. It is preferred that students are dropped off in the identified zone, rather than walked into the building. If you need to enter the building for an appointment you must park your vehicle in a parking space, and carefully walk your child(ren) into the building.

Thank you for following these procedures, as we all work together to make the arrival process safe for students, parents, and staff.

PARENT PICK UP CARDS:

If you plan on picking up your child(ren) from school, please see Mrs. Freimark in the office for a set of Parent Pick Up Cards unless you have yours from last year.

STUDENT DISMISSAL:

To help with the flow of traffic, parent pick-up students will be dismissed to the main entrance beginning at 3:30 pm. Please be sure to have your pick-up card out, and your child(ren)'s card

attached to their book bag in a visible location. Please be patient with this process. If you don't have a parent pick-up card, you will be asked to enter the office and provide your ID.

Pick up cards will be available to be signed out on the 17th, 18th and 21st. Please stop in the office.

For your child(ren)'s safety, we will only release students to parents/guardians with matching pick-up cards that are waiting in the lobby.

FROM NURSE LIBBI:

Happy Friday!! This week I have been seeing and getting reports of Hand Foot and Mouth Disease. It is a mild contagious viral infection. Symptoms can be one or more of the following, rash, can be blister like on hands and feet, buttucks. In the mouth they can be on the tongue, throat, gums and inside of cheeks. Fever, runny nose, sore throat and tiredness. Please keep your children home If they have fever or open lesions or if developing new sores in the past 24-48 hours, or if just not feeling well. Good handwashing is very important. If we all do our part we can help stop the spread of this. I am still seeing strep throat, fevers, cough and vomiting. As always please if your student has fever 100.4 or higher they cannot come to school until they have been fever free without the use of fever reducing medication for 24 hrs. Thank you for your understanding and cooperation. It is greatly appreciated and needed. Have a great and safe weekend!

GRADE LEVEL AND TEAM UPDATES:

Kindergarten- We are so excited about our field trip to Fleitz on Monday, remember to dress for the weather. The students all enjoyed their first Jet Shop and are excited they get to do it 3 more times this year! Be on the lookout for grade cards coming home on Wednesday October 25th. This is a reminder that parent/teacher conferences on November 87h and 9th, we look forward to seeing you and discussing your child's progress then. Ff and Nn are the letters we are focusing on this week and next week we have our first high frequency words (**the, at, cat, sat, I, a**) as well as continuing with letters! In math we continue to work on numbers 0-10 as well as 2D shapes. Remember to keep reading with your child, the forms are due back to school on November 1st.

1st Grade- We hope everyone had a great week! Quarter 3 has begun, which means we will be diving deeper into learning more words, reading fluently, writing, and continuing to add and subtract numbers within 20. Coming up next week in spelling, students will be reading and writing using I-blends like in the word plum. In Wonders ELA, students will be reading stories and talking about what makes a pet special. In our Bigldeas Math books, we will continue to

add and subtract numbers using different strategies. For our Focus 3 Fridays, we are talking about the difference between a default response and a disciplined response.

We hope you have a great weekend!!

2nd Grade- Next week the second graders will read various stories from our Wonders Series about animal families. We will focus on finding text evidence, making predictions, and sequencing events of the story. In Math we will continue Chapter 4, Fluently Add Within 100. Grade cards will be sent home next Wednesday, October 25. You may keep the contents inside the envelope, but please sign and return the envelope, thank you! Parent/Teacher conferences are quickly approaching! Conferences will be held Tuesday, November 7, all day and November 9, in the evening. Please contact your child's teacher to sign up for a conference, if you have not already done so. Students in Ms. Singlar's class will attend their last swim lesson on Friday, October 27. Please make sure your child wears their swimsuit to school under their clothes. They will also need to bring a towel, pair of underwear, and a bag for wet clothes! Have a great weekend!

3rd Grade- It's hard to believe it is the beginning of 2nd quarter already! Grade cards will be sent home next Wednesday, Oct. 25th. All 3rd graders will be taking the Ohio State Test in Reading on Tuesday, Oct. 24th and Wednesday, Oct. 25th in the morning before lunch. RESPECTFUL


- Honest, trustworthy, and respectful
