Zones of Regulation:

Throughout the past couple of school years, a select group of teachers have been introducing the idea of ZONES into their classrooms. At this point, students in grade K-3 have a good foundation about this self-regulation program. Please take a moment to read the letter created by Mrs. Kellar, summarizing the idea behind ZONES.

The ZON'S of Regulation is a valuable tool for helping elementary students recognize and manage their emotions, which is crucial for their social and emotional development. It's designed to help children understand and communicate their feelings and, in turn, develop self-regulation skills. When children understand their emotions, how those emotions affect their behavior, and how to self-regulate, they are able to achieve an optimal state of alertness. This program has been introduced to students in grades K through 3rd grade.

The program categorizes emotions into four color-coded zones:

- Blue Zone (Sad, Tired, Sick, or Slow): In this zone, children might feel sad, tired, or unwell. They may feel like resting or needing comfort.
- Green Zone (Happy, Calm, Focused, or Ready to Learn): This is the ideal zone for learning and socializing. Children in the green zone feel calm, focused, and ready to engage with their peers and learning activities.
- Yellow Zone (Excited, Frustrated, Worried, or Anxious): In this zone, children experience heightened emotions. They might feel anxious, excited, or frustrated. It's a signal to be aware and use self-regulation strategies.
- Red Zone (Angry, Scared, Terrified, or Excited or Explosive): This is the zone where strong and intense emotions are felt. Children might feel very angry, scared, or out of control. It's essential to help them regulate back to the green zone from the red zone.

Learning to use the Zones includes self-regulation strategies such as deep breathing, mindfulness techniques, taking a break, talking to a trusted adult, or using sensory tools like fidgets or stress balls. Parents are encouraged to work with their children on identifying which strategies work best for them.

Parents play a crucial role in reinforcing the concepts taught in the Zones of Regulation program. They can practice the program's language at home, provide a safe space for their child to express their feelings, and model appropriate emotional regulation.

ClassDojo:

ClassDojo is a communication app for the classroom. It connects teachers, parents, and students who use it to share photos, videos, and messages through the school day. They use ClassDojo to work together as a team, share in the classroom experience, and bring big ideas to life in their classrooms and homes. Jerusalem teachers may be using ClassDojo in a variety of ways within their classroom throughout the school year. Not all teachers are currently using this tool within their classroom at this time, as it is their choice. Some teachers will continue to communicate with parents through email, phone, newsletters, etc. However, we encourage you to sign up for ClassDojo to receive important building updates/messages from Mr. Straka. Information on signing up for ClassDojo will be sent home from your child's teacher.

Cell Phones and other electronic devices:

Just a reminder that all cell phones, smartwatches, and other personal electronic devices must be turned off and placed in the student's lockers upon arriving at school. These devices are often a distraction to students, and are not permitted to be with students during the day. Thanks for your cooperation!

From the Office:

School fees can be paid in the office.

As we are starting to wear coats, please write your students name in the coat/sweatshirt/hoodie somewhere. There are MANY lost items in the Gym hallway.

Parent pickup at the end of the day. All calls should be made by 3:00 and no later. This will give the teacher time to check messages and drastically reduce the possibility of the student being in the wrong line. Thank you for your understanding.

School Supplies:

This year, we have decided to purchase a variety of school supplies for each classroom to start the year. This allowed us to decrease the number of items that parents are responsible for purchasing.

Morning Drop-Off Routine:

Please see the following important information involving the morning drop-off routine for students. Students will not be permitted to enter the building until **8:50 am**. Please do not let your child(ren) exit the vehicle until the main entrance doors are opened. Thanks for your cooperation!

- Please drive **slowly**.
- Please drop off your student(s) **between** the Safety Markers (plastic figures with flags). Do not drop off outside of this zone.
- Please stay in the car drop-off line until your child(ren) exits the vehicle. Do not drive around other vehicles to move ahead in line, or to exit the lot.
- Please have any and all children in your vehicle exit on the **building/driver side** of the vehicle.
- **Do not park in the drop off line.** We need to keep the traffic moving. It is preferred that students are dropped off in the identified zone, rather than walked into the building. If you need to enter the building for an appointment you must park your vehicle in a parking space, and carefully walk your child(ren) into the building.

Thank you for following these procedures, as we all work together to make the arrival process safe for students, parents, and staff.

Parent Pick Up Cards:

If you plan on picking up your child(ren) from school, please see Mrs. Freimark in the office for a set of Parent Pick Up Cards unless you have yours from last year.

Student Dismissal:

To help with the flow of traffic, parent pick-up students will be dismissed to the main entrance beginning at 3:30 pm. Please be sure to have your pick-up card out, and your child(ren)'s card attached to their book bag in a visible location. Please be patient with this process. If you don't have a parent pick-up card, you will be asked to enter the office and provide your ID.

Pick up cards will be available to be signed out on the 17th, 18th and 21st. Please stop in the office.

For your child(ren)'s safety, we will only release students to parents/guardians with matching pickup cards that are waiting in the lobby.

Happy Fri-Yay!! Christmas is getting closer and the excitement is in the air. That said, we are still having reports of strep throat, gastrointestinal illnesses, coughing. fevers and newest report of RSV. If your student is not feeling well and symptomatic please be mindful and keep them home. I would love to see everyone healthy for the holidays. Remember fevers of 100.4 or higher must stay home until fever free for 24hrs without use of fever reducing medication. If your student has strep or pinkeye they must be on antibiotics for a full 24 hours before returning to school. If we all do our part we can help with keeping the students and staff healthy. Be safe, and have a great weekend!!

Grade Level and Team Updates:

Kindergarten- Can you believe the quarter is almost over? We will start our grade card testing this week and it will go into the week of the 18th. Our focus this week will be on the words **or, for, so, go, no, of**. Remember to send your child with appropriate clothes to play outside, and keep working with them to get everything on and zipped without help. There is lots of sickness going around right now please be aware that your child has to be fever free for 24 without medication before they can come back to school. We want all the students to stay as healthy as possible.

1st Grade- First grade has been doing a great job these past couple of long weeks! Please remember to talk to your child about how their day has gone and if there are any problems we can work out together. In ELA next week, students will be reading and writing words with a magic e in them, like in the word make. In Chapter 5 in math, students are using strategies to subtract numbers within 20. We hope you have a great weekend!

2nd Grade- Next week in Language Arts we will read various stories from our Wonders Series. There will be no spelling list as we will be completing our end of the quarter assessments. Please keep in mind the week of December 18-21, we have special days planned as we approach Christmas Break! Monday is Candy Cane Day and students may wear red and white. Tuesday is Grinch Day and students may wear green/Grinch shirts and Santa hats. Wednesday is Elf Day and students can wear red, white, and green, or dress like an elf. Thursday is Polar Express Day and students may wear their robe/pajamas and BRING slippers to wear after they arrive at school. The December reading calendar will be due when students return from Christmas break. The January reading calendar will be sent home before break so the students can start recording their January reading. Have a wonderful weekend!

3rd Grade- Third grade students are preparing for our upcoming music program next week. Our program will be Tuesday, Dec. 12th at 6:30pm. The doors will open at 6:00pm.
