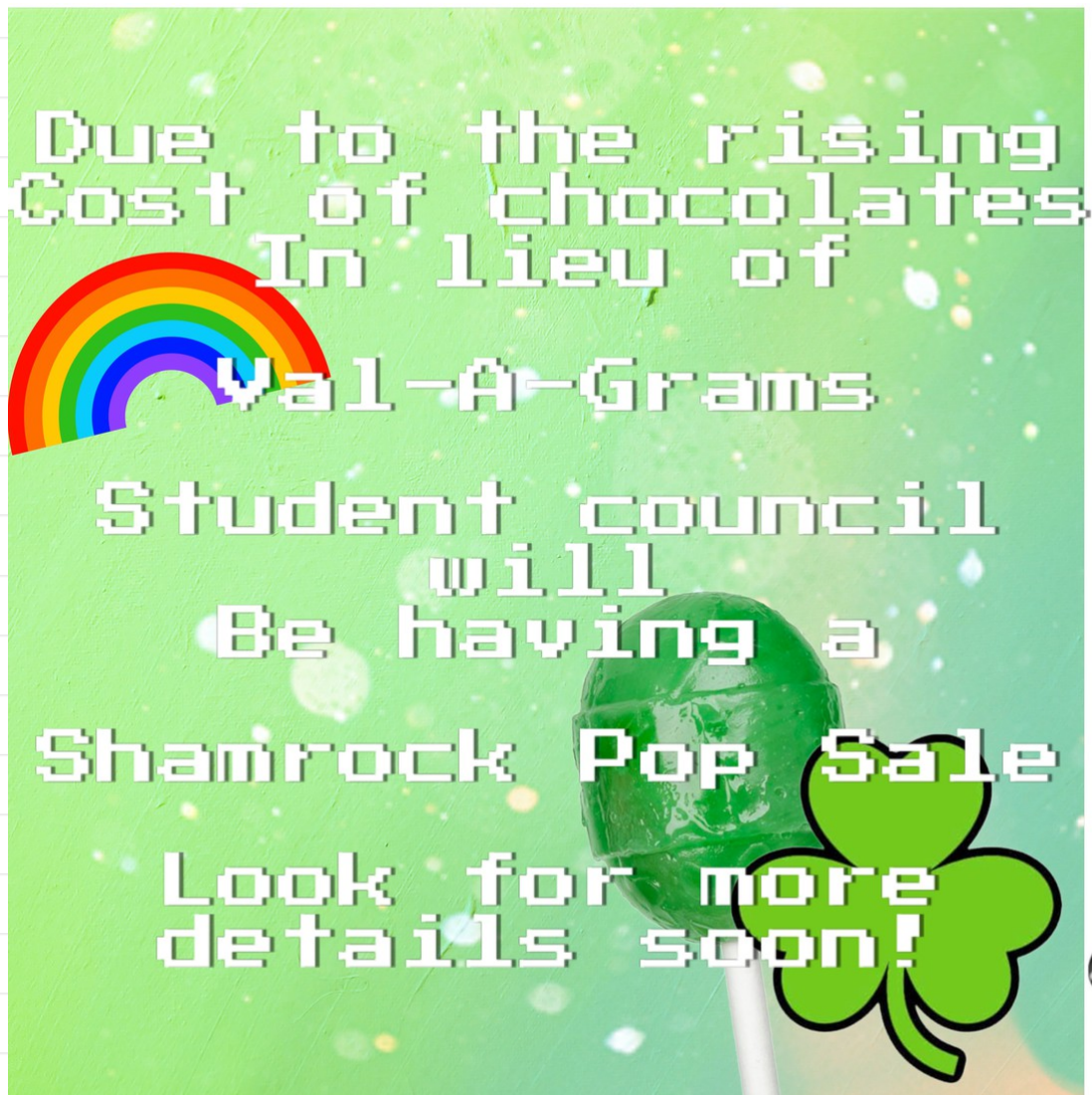

## Zones of Regulation:

Throughout the past couple of school years, a select group of teachers have been introducing the idea of ZONES into their classrooms. At this point, students in grade K-3 have a good foundation about this self-regulation program. Please take a moment to read the letter created by Mrs. Kellar, summarizing the idea behind ZONES.



The **ZONES** of Regulation is a valuable tool for helping elementary students recognize and manage their emotions, which is crucial for their social and emotional development. It's designed to help children understand and communicate their feelings and, in turn, develop self-regulation skills. When children understand their emotions, how those emotions affect their behavior, and how to self-regulate, they are able to achieve an optimal state of alertness. This program has been introduced to students in grades K through 3rd grade.

The program categorizes emotions into four color-coded zones:

- **Blue Zone** (Sad, Tired, Sick, or Slow): In this zone, children might feel sad, tired, or unwell. They may feel like resting or needing comfort.
- **Green Zone** (Happy, Calm, Focused, or Ready to Learn): This is the ideal zone for learning and socializing. Children in the green zone feel calm, focused, and ready to engage with their peers and learning activities.
- **Yellow Zone** (Excited, Frustrated, Worried, or Anxious): In this zone, children experience heightened emotions. They might feel anxious, excited, or frustrated. It's a signal to be aware and use self-regulation strategies.
- **Red Zone** (Angry, Scared, Terrified, or Excited or Explosive): This is the zone where strong and intense emotions are felt. Children might feel very angry, scared, or out of control. It's essential to help them regulate back to the green zone from the red zone.

Learning to use the Zones includes self-regulation strategies such as deep breathing, mindfulness techniques, taking a break, talking to a trusted adult, or using sensory tools like fidgets or stress balls. Parents are encouraged to work with their children on identifying which strategies work best for them.

Parents play a crucial role in reinforcing the concepts taught in the Zones of Regulation program. They can practice the program's language at home, provide a safe space for their child to express their feelings, and model appropriate emotional regulation.

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## ClassDojo:

**ClassDojo** is a communication app for the classroom. It connects teachers, parents, and students who use it to share photos, videos, and messages through the school day. They use **ClassDojo** to work together as a team, share in the classroom experience, and bring big ideas to life in their classrooms and homes. Jerusalem teachers may be using ClassDojo in a variety of ways within their classroom throughout the school year. Not all teachers are currently using this tool within their classroom at this time, as it is their choice. Some teachers will continue to communicate with parents through email, phone, newsletters, etc. **However, we encourage you to sign up for ClassDojo to receive important building updates/messages from Mr. Straka.** Information on signing up for ClassDojo will be sent home from your child's teacher.

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## Cell Phones and other electronic devices:


Just a reminder that all cell phones, smartwatches, and other personal electronic devices must be turned off and placed in the student's lockers upon arriving at school. These devices are often a distraction to students, and are not permitted to be with students during the day. Thanks for your cooperation!

## From the Office:

Parent pickup at the end of the day. All calls should be made by 3:00 and no later. This will give the teacher time to check messages and drastically reduce the possibility of the student being in the wrong line. Thank you for your understanding.

## Deliveries for Students:

Jerusalem Elementary has implemented a system for items to be delivered to students once the day begins. **Please leave items on the table outside the office door**, complete the delivery log, and notify the secretary of your delivery. Thanks for your cooperation!

## School Supplies:

This year, we have decided to purchase a variety of school supplies for each classroom to start the year. This allowed us to decrease the number of items that parents are responsible for purchasing.

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## Morning Drop-Off Routine:

Please see the following important information involving the morning drop-off routine for students. Students will not be permitted to enter the building until **8:50 am**. Please do not let your child(ren) exit the vehicle until the main entrance doors are opened. Thanks for your cooperation!

- Please drive **slowly**.
- Please drop off your student(s) **between** the Safety Markers (plastic figures with flags). Do not drop off outside of this zone.
- Please stay in the car drop-off line until your child(ren) exits the vehicle. Do not drive around other vehicles to move ahead in line, or to exit the lot.
- Please have any and all children in your vehicle exit on the **building/driver side** of the vehicle.
- **Do not park in the drop off line.** We need to keep the traffic moving. It is preferred that students are dropped off in the identified zone, rather than walked into the building. If you need to enter the building for an appointment you must park your vehicle in a parking space, and carefully walk your child(ren) into the building.


Thank you for following these procedures, as we all work together to make the arrival process safe for students, parents, and staff.

## Parent Pick Up Cards:

If you plan on picking up your child(ren) from school, please see Mrs. Freimark in the office for a set of Parent Pick Up Cards unless you have yours from last year.

## Student Dismissal:

To help with the flow of traffic, parent pick-up students will be dismissed to the main entrance beginning at 3:30 pm. Please be sure to have your pick-up card out, and your child(ren)'s card attached to their book bag in a visible location. Please be patient with this process. If you don't have a parent pick-up card, you will be asked to enter the office and provide your ID.





Pick up cards will be available to be signed out on the 17th, 18th and 21st. Please stop in the office.

**For your child(ren)'s safety, we will only release students to parents/guardians with matching pick-up cards that are waiting in the lobby.**

Happy Friday!! A lot of gastrointestinal symptoms are being seen this week, as well as reports of flu, strep throat, Remember students must be fever free for 24 hours without use of fever reducing medication to return to school. Have a great weekend.

### **Grade Level and Team Updates:**

**Kindergarten-** Happy Valentine's week! Make sure to check with your child's teacher about what they are doing for Valentine's Day. Keep practicing your words at home we see the progress at school! Remember to keep reading for the monthly reading calendar, that there is no school on Monday Feb. 19th, and conferences will be held on Tuesday Feb. 20st so there is no school.

**1st Grade-** Next week in first grade, students will read and write using words with ng endings like in the word, king. We will read from Wonders on how people help out in the community and focus on writing our opinions and forming sentences. In math, students are comparing two digit numbers with greater than, less than and equal to symbols. Valentine's Day is Wednesday next week, we are excited to share treats and kindness that day in our classrooms. Coming up, the week of the 19th, there is no school on Monday the 19th and also Tuesday the 20th. Parent/teacher conferences are on Tuesday the 20th, so please make sure to touch base with your child's teacher. Have a great weekend!

**2nd Grade-** Next week we will read the story, Looking at Lincoln. We will learn about President's Day and some of our most famous presidents. In Math the students we will finish Chapter 10, Subtract Numbers Within 1,000. The spelling words for next week include consonant+le patterns. It's almost Valentine's Day!! The students are excited for their classroom party next Wednesday, February 14! The second graders are being asked to decorate a Valentine Box **at home** which will be used for the valentine cards passed out by their classmates. The decorated box may be a shoebox or similar size box, and can be sent to school on Wednesday only! Please have your child's name clearly visible on the top of the box and have an opening in the box which will be big enough for classmates to deliver valentines. Valentine cards may be sent in for the children to pass out, but please make sure there is a card for each child in the class. For quick and easy delivery of the valentine cards, please have your child sign THEIR NAME ONLY! DO NOT ADDRESS THE CARDS WITH STUDENT NAMES ON THEM. Have a wonderful weekend!

**3rd Grade-** In our studies next week, we will be continuing to compare and contrast with informational text passages in ELA. The students will be learning how to measure to the nearest quarter, half, and whole inch as part of our Math studies. We will begin a new unit on government in







Social Studies. Students will be learning the differences between rules and laws and the rights and responsibilities of citizens in a community.
