

Oregon City Schools STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math) Academy is offering an opportunity for fourth grade students to participate in after-school STEM activities. Lego Education WeDo 2.0 kits and activities will be used during this session, with students collaborating to complete various projects. Students will learn basic block programming, going beyond just building things with Lego bricks.



Zones of Regulation:

Throughout the past couple of school years, a select group of teachers have been introducing the idea of ZONES into their classrooms. At this point, students in grade K-3 have a good foundation about this self-regulation program. Please take a moment to read the letter created by Mrs. Kellar, summarizing the idea behind ZONES.

The ZON. S of Regulation is a valuable tool for helping elementary students recognize and manage their emotions, which is crucial for their social and emotional development. It's designed to help children understand and communicate their feelings and, in turn, develop self-regulation skills. When children understand their emotions, how those emotions affect their behavior, and how to self-regulate, they are able to achieve an optimal state of alertness. This program has been introduced to students in grades K through 3rd grade.

The program categorizes emotions into four color-coded zones:

- Blue Zone (Sad, Tired, Sick, or Slow): In this zone, children might feel sad, tired, or unwell. They may feel like resting or needing comfort.
- Green Zone (Happy, Calm, Focused, or Ready to Learn): This is the ideal zone for learning and socializing. Children in the green zone feel calm, focused, and ready to engage with their peers and learning activities.
- Yellow Zone (Excited, Frustrated, Worried, or Anxious): In this zone, children experience heightened emotions. They might feel anxious, excited, or frustrated. It's a signal to be aware and use self-regulation strategies.
- Red Zone (Angry, Scared, Terrified, or Excited or Explosive): This is the zone where strong and intense emotions are felt. Children might feel very angry, scared, or out of control. It's essential to help them regulate back to the green zone from the red zone.

Learning to use the Zones includes self-regulation strategies such as deep breathing, mindfulness techniques, taking a break, talking to a trusted adult, or using sensory tools like fidgets or stress balls. Parents are encouraged to work with their children on identifying which strategies work best for them.

Parents play a crucial role in reinforcing the concepts taught in the Zones of Regulation program. They can practice the program's language at home, provide a safe space for their child to express their feelings, and model appropriate emotional regulation.

ClassDojo:

ClassDojo is a communication app for the classroom. It connects teachers, parents, and students who use it to share photos, videos, and messages through the school day. They use ClassDojo to work together as a team, share in the classroom experience, and bring big ideas to life in their classrooms and homes. Jerusalem teachers may be using ClassDojo in a variety of ways within their classroom throughout the school year. Not all teachers are currently using this tool within their classroom at this time, as it is their choice. Some teachers will continue to communicate with parents through email, phone, newsletters, etc. However, we encourage you to sign up for ClassDojo to receive important building updates/messages from Mr. Straka. Information on signing up for ClassDojo will be sent home from your child's teacher.

Cell Phones and other electronic devices:

Just a reminder that all cell phones, smartwatches, and other personal electronic devices must be turned off and placed in the student's lockers upon arriving at school. These devices are often a distraction to students, and are not permitted to be with students during the day. Thanks for your cooperation!

From the Office:

School fees can be paid in the office.

As we are starting to wear coats, please write your students name in the coat/sweatshirt/hoodie somewhere. There are MANY lost items in the Gym hallway.

Parent pickup at the end of the day. All calls should be made by 3:00 and no later. This will give the

Deliveries for Students:

Jerusalem Elementary has implemented a system for items to be delivered to students once the day begins. Please leave items on the table outside the office door, complete the delivery log, and notify the secretary of your delivery. Thanks for your cooperation!

School Supplies:

This year, we have decided to purchase a variety of school supplies for each classroom to start the year. This allowed us to decrease the number of items that parents are responsible for purchasing.

Morning Drop-Off Routine:

Please see the following important information involving the morning drop-off routine for students. Students will not be permitted to enter the building until **8:50 am**. Please do not let your child(ren) exit the vehicle until the main entrance doors are opened. Thanks for your cooperation!

- Please drive slowly.
- Please drop off your student(s) **between** the Safety Markers (plastic figures with flags). Do not drop off outside of this zone.
- Please stay in the car drop-off line until your child(ren) exits the vehicle. Do not drive around other vehicles to move ahead in line, or to exit the lot.
- Please have any and all children in your vehicle exit on the building/driver side of the vehicle.
- **Do not park in the drop off line.** We need to keep the traffic moving. It is preferred that students are dropped off in the identified zone, rather than walked into the building. If you need to enter the building for an appointment you must park your vehicle in a parking space, and carefully walk your child(ren) into the building.

Thank you for following these procedures, as we all work together to make the arrival process safe for students, parents, and staff.

If you plan on picking up your child(ren) from school, please see Mrs. Freimark in the office for a set of Parent Pick Up Cards unless you have yours from last year.

Student Dismissal:

To help with the flow of traffic, parent pick-up students will be dismissed to the main entrance beginning at 3:30 pm. Please be sure to have your pick-up card out, and your child(ren)'s card attached to their book bag in a visible location. Please be patient with this process. If you don't have a parent pick-up card, you will be asked to enter the office and provide your ID.

Pick up cards will be available to be signed out on the 17th, 18th and 21st. Please stop in the office.

For your child(ren)'s safety, we will only release students to parents/guardians with matching pickup cards that are waiting in the lobby.

Happy Friday!! I hope everyone is enjoying the Spring Like weather, even the warm rain. The clinic remains busy with reports of Flu, strep throat and gastrointestinal symptoms. Grade Level and Team Updates:

Kindergarten- The end of 3rd quarter is quickly approaching so keep practicing those words at home. We will start testing for grade cards soon. Remember to keep reading for the monthly reading calendar, they are due Friday March 1st.

1st Grade- Next week in first grade, students will be reading and writing words with -nk endings. In Wonders, students will talk about how to classify and categorize things. We'll read "A Lost Button" from Toad and Frog and "Sort It Out". Students will be introduced to r-controlled vowels, as well as new vocabulary. In Bigldeas math, we will begin Chapter 8 in our new Volume 2 math books. Chapter 8 is on mental math, adding 10 and subtracting 10. Lastly, with the quarter coming to an end, we'll begin assessing our quarterly assessments. We hope you have a great weekend and we'll see our students back on Monday!

2nd Grade- Next week we will read various stories from our Wonders Series and will also be discussing slavery and learning about the Underground Railroad. In Math we will begin Chapter 14, Money and Time. The spelling pattern words for the week contain the old, ind, ild spelling patterns. On Monday, your child will come home with information about our 2nd Grade Wax Museum. Your child will need to determine their top THREE choices for the important person they would like to portray. Please help your child choose their top three choices which are appropriate for them. The choice list is due on Monday, March 4, and the students will be notified by Friday, March 8, who they will portray for the Wax Museum! As February is coming to an end, keep in mind the February Reading calendar is due by Friday, March 1. Have a great weekend!

3rd Grade- In our studies next week, we will continue to work on writing informational reports comparing and contrasting two different kinds of penguins in ELA. We will finish learning about the rights and responsibilities of citizens and rules and laws in a community. There will be an assessment next week. In Math, we will be measuring mass and volume.

Physical Education with Mr. Allen- This month we are doing the Kids Heart Challenge in PE class. We are focusing on activities and exercises to strengthen our bodies and improve our cardiovascular endurance. build their kindness bow and arrow. Kindergarten and first graders are practicing a tool called Book Creator and doing a science experiment called Magic Milk.

Character Lessons with Mrs. Hower- February has flown by! This month our classroom lessons were focused on CALMING/COPING skills. Kindergarten and 3rd grade focused on Anger Management, while 1st, 2nd, and 4th focused on Calming Skills.

Event+Response=Outcome (E+R=O). Our RESPONSE should show RESPECT.
