


4th Grade Idiom Day:

OREGON CITY SCHOOLS PROUD OF PERFORMANCE

Oregon City Schools (OCS) is celebrating the student growth documented by the latest 2023 state report card. This report card uses a FIVE star rating system to document performance of the overall district and each individual school. The OCS Board of Education, teachers and administrators have been working very hard for years adapting to the changing educational environment, adjusting curriculum, cultivating internal culture and assisting individual students to achieve success. OCS continues to improve and provide excellence in Academics, Athletics and the Arts.

We are excited about the academic progress we are making and want our community to celebrate with us. OCS maintained or increased our Star ratings in all 27 categories measured. Here is a summary of the overall ratings:

Oregon City Schools offers a wide variety of programs and courses throughout the district. Zones of Regulation:

Throughout the past couple of school years, a select group of teachers have been introducing the idea of ZONES into their classrooms. At this point, students in grade K-3 have a good foundation about this self-regulation program. Please take a moment to read the letter created by Mrs. Kellar, summarizing the idea behind ZONES.

The ZONES of Regulation is a valuable tool for helping elementary students recognize and manage their emotions, which is crucial for their social and emotional development. It's designed to help children understand and communicate their feelings and, in turn, develop self-regulation skills. When children understand their emotions, how those emotions affect their behavior, and how to self-regulate, they are able to achieve an optimal state of alertness. This program has been introduced to students in grades K through 3rd grade.

The program categorizes emotions into four color-coded zones:

- Blue Zone (Sad, Tired, Sick, or Slow): In this zone, children might feel sad, tired, or unwell. They may feel like resting or needing comfort.
- Green Zone (Happy, Calm, Focused, or Ready to Learn): This is the ideal zone for learning and socializing. Children in the green zone feel calm, focused, and ready to engage with their peers and learning activities.
- Yellow Zone (Excited, Frustrated, Worried, or Anxious): In this zone, children experience heightened emotions. They might feel anxious, excited, or frustrated. It's a signal to be aware and use self-regulation strategies.
- Red Zone (Angry, Scared, Terrified, or Excited or Explosive): This is the zone where strong and intense emotions are felt. Children might feel very angry, scared, or out of control. It's essential to help them regulate back to the green zone from the red zone.

Learning to use the Zones includes self-regulation strategies such as deep breathing, mindfulness techniques, taking a break, talking to a trusted adult, or using sensory tools like fidgets or stress balls. Parents are encouraged to work with their children on identifying which strategies work best for them.

Parents play a crucial role in reinforcing the concepts taught in the Zones of Regulation program. They can practice the program's language at home, provide a safe space for their child to express their feelings, and model appropriate emotional regulation.

ClassDojo:

ClassDojo is a communication app for the classroom. It connects teachers, parents, and students who use it to share photos, videos, and messages through the school day. They use ClassDojo to work together as a team, share in the classroom experience, and bring big ideas to life in their classrooms and homes. Jerusalem teachers may be using ClassDojo in a variety of ways within their classroom throughout the school year. Not all teachers are currently using this tool within their classroom at this time, as it is their choice. Some teachers will continue to communicate with parents through email, phone, newsletters, etc. However, we encourage you to sign up for ClassDojo to receive important building updates/messages from Mr. Straka. Information on signing up for ClassDojo will be sent home from your child's teacher.

Cell Phones and other electronic devices:

Just a reminder that all cell phones, smartwatches, and other personal electronic devices must be turned off and placed in the student's lockers upon arriving at school. These devices are often a distraction to students, and are not permitted to be with students during the day. Thanks for your cooperation!

From the Office:

School fees can be paid in the office.

As we are starting to wear coats, please write your students name in the coat/sweatshirt/hoodie somewhere. There are MANY lost items in the Gym hallway.

Deliveries for Students:

Jerusalem Elementary has implemented a system for items to be delivered to students once the day begins. Please leave items on the table outside the office door, complete the delivery log, and notify the secretary of your delivery. Thanks for your cooperation!

This year, we have decided to purchase a variety of school supplies for each classroom to start the year. This allowed us to decrease the number of items that parents are responsible for purchasing.

Morning Drop-Off Routine:

Please see the following important information involving the morning drop-off routine for students. Students will not be permitted to enter the building until **8:50 am**. Please do not let your child(ren) exit the vehicle until the main entrance doors are opened. Thanks for your cooperation!

- Please drive slowly.
- Please drop off your student(s) **between** the Safety Markers (plastic figures with flags). Do not drop off outside of this zone.
- Please stay in the car drop-off line until your child(ren) exits the vehicle. Do not drive around other vehicles to move ahead in line, or to exit the lot.
- Please have any and all children in your vehicle exit on the building/driver side of the vehicle.
- Do not park in the drop off line. We need to keep the traffic moving. It is preferred that students
 are dropped off in the identified zone, rather than walked into the building. If you need to enter
 the building for an appointment you must park your vehicle in a parking space, and carefully
 walk your child(ren) into the building.

Thank you for following these procedures, as we all work together to make the arrival process safe for students, parents, and staff.

If you plan on picking up your child(ren) from school, please see Mrs. Freimark in the office for a set of Parent Pick Up Cards unless you have yours from last year.

Student Dismissal:

To help with the flow of traffic, parent pick-up students will be dismissed to the main entrance beginning at 3:30 pm. Please be sure to have your pick-up card out, and your child(ren)'s card attached to their book bag in a visible location. Please be patient with this process. If you don't have a parent pick-up card, you will be asked to enter the office and provide your ID.

Pick up cards will be available to be signed out on the 17th, 18th and 21st. Please stop in the office.

For your child(ren)'s safety, we will only release students to parents/guardians with matching pickup cards that are waiting in the lobby.

Grade Level and Team Updates:

Kindergarten- We continue to practice our words and work on blending our sounds into words everyday. Keep practicing your words at home. The students are becoming good readers, remember to keep working with them at home so they continue to grow their skills. We are testing for grade cards this week, it is hard to believe the end of 3rd quarter is next week!

1st Grade- Next week in first grade, students will be reading and writing words with the -ed suffix at the end. In Wonders, students will discuss what they see in the sky. We'll read "Cloudette" and "Kitten's First Full Moon". In Bigldeas math, we will continue Chapter 8 in our new Volume 2 books. Chapter 8 is on mental math, adding 10 and subtracting 10. Lastly, with the quarter coming to an end, we'll begin assessing our quarterly assessments. We hope you have a great weekend and we'll see our students back on Monday!

2nd Grade- Next week we will read the various stories from our Wonders Series. We will focus on determining the lesson of the story and supporting answers with text evidence. We will continue our Weather unit in Science and in Math we will continue working on Chapter 14, Money and Time. There will be no spelling next week as we will be working on completing our end of the quarter assessments. Please keep in mind your child's top three Wax Museum choices are due Monday, March 4! The students will find out which important person they will portray by the end of next week! The students will then find books at the library to read about their important person and complete research/activities for this project in school. The parent's responsibilities are to look for an outfit and help your child practice their speech, once it is written. If you have any questions, please contact your child's teacher. Have a great weekend!

3rd Grade- It's hard to believe but there are only 7 days left of 3rd quarter! We are wrapping up our unit on local government in Social Studies. Students will be learning about the different types of local government including municipal (city), township, county, and special. In Math, we are finishing our measurement of mass and capacity using grams, kilograms, milliliters, and liters. Please

continue to have your child practice his/her multiplication flash cards daily at home. We are continuing to work on writing informational reports comparing and contrasting different types of penguins. Please save the date of May 9th for our field trip to Sauder Village. More details will be coming in the next few weeks! Have a great weekend!

Most have finished the "White belt" and a few have been working hard and already finished their "Black belt". The third graders have completed the 1st round of Music March Madness. Time to move the winners to the 2nd round. The K-2 students are getting better every class by practicing the words of their songs. Please add our performance dates to your calendars. There will also be some assemblies that will be held during the school day that our students will be performing in. There will be more information sent out to the grades involved as we get closer to these assemblies.

STEAM with Mrs. Minnick- This week in STEAM, 4th graders continue to work on cardboard creations. Second and third-graders use the engineering design process to create, test, and re-build bow and arrows. Our kindergarten and first graders use Book Creator to write stories about bald eagles and winter animals. We have been following the live cam on Bonnie and Clyde. A pair of bald eagles that have 2 eggs in their nest. They live in Milford Ohio just outside of Cincinnati!

Character Lessons with Mrs. Hower- In March, the character focus will be centered around the HOPE program. HOPE stands for Health and Opioid Prevention Education. These lessons are required through the state of Ohio K-12. At the elementary level, our focus is making Safe and Healthy choices...

When it comes to medicine the 5 T's are: Don't Touch, Don't Taste, Don't Take! Tell a Trusted Adult!

Event+Response=Outcome (E+R=O). Our RESPONSE should show RESPECT.
