




8th Grade Breakfast on March 25th

Throughout the next few months, we will begin the process of planning for next year. This includes assessing our master schedule, the effectiveness of our curricular programs, establishing our staffing needs, and, of course, creating class lists for the 2024-2025 school year.

This process of creating class lists requires time and careful consideration. Initially, your child's teacher will review his/her current class list. During this stage, your child's teacher will indicate the academic and behavioral needs of individual students. This information along with the overall composition of the class is considered in order to make the best possible classroom assignment for each student.

If you feel that a particular learning situation may be more appropriate for your child, you are asked to complete the K-2 Teacher Request Form so that it can be taken into consideration. Completed forms, with specific information that may help place a child in the most appropriate setting, need to be submitted by the end of April.

Due to the structure of the 3rd and 4th grade schedules, and the teacher's individual teaching assignments, requests for these grades will not be taken.

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Zones of Regulation:

Throughout the past couple of school years, a select group of teachers have been introducing the idea of ZONES into their classrooms. At this point, students in grade K-3 have a good foundation about this self-regulation program. Please take a moment to read the letter created by Mrs. Kellar, summarizing the idea behind ZONES.

The ZON: S of Regulation is a valuable tool for helping elementary students recognize and manage their emotions, which is crucial for their social and emotional development. It's designed to help children understand and communicate their feelings and, in turn, develop self-regulation skills. When children understand their emotions, how those emotions affect their behavior, and how to self-regulate, they are able to achieve an optimal state of alertness. This program has been introduced to students in grades K through 3rd grade. The program categorizes emotions into four color-coded zones: . Blue Zone (Sad, Tired, Sick, or Slow): In this zone, children might feel sad, tired, or unwell. They may feel like resting or needing comfort. . Green Zone (Happy, Calm, Focused, or Ready to Learn): This is the ideal zone for learning and socializing. Children in the green zone feel calm, focused, and ready to engage with their peers and learning activities. Yellow Zone (Excited, Frustrated, Worried, or Anxious): In this zone, children experience heightened emotions. They might feel anxious, excited, or frustrated. It's a signal to be re and use self-regulation strategies Red Zone (Angry, Scared, Terrified, or Excited or Explosive): This is the zone where strong and intense emotions are felt. Children might feel very angry, scared, or out of control. It's essential to help them regulate back to the green zone from the red zone. Learning to use the Zones includes self-regulation strategies such as deep breathing, mindfulness techniques, taking a break, talking to a trusted adult, or using sensory tools like fidgets or stress balls. Parents are encouraged to work with their children on identifying which strategies work best for them. Parents play a crucial role in reinforcing the concepts taught in the Zones of Regulation program. They can practice the program's language at home, provide a safe space for their child to express their feelings, and model appropriate emotional regulation. ClassDojo:

ClassDojo is a communication app for the classroom. It connects teachers, parents, and students who use it to share photos, videos, and messages through the school day. They use ClassDojo to work together as a team, share in the classroom experience, and bring big ideas to life in their classrooms and homes. Jerusalem teachers may be using ClassDojo in a variety of ways within their classroom throughout the school year. Not all teachers are currently using this tool within their classroom at this time, as it is their choice. Some teachers will continue to communicate with parents through email, phone, newsletters, etc. However, we encourage you to sign up for ClassDojo to receive important building updates/messages from Mr. Straka. Information on signing up for ClassDojo will be sent home from your child's teacher.

Cell Phones and other electronic devices:

Just a reminder that all cell phones, smartwatches, and other personal electronic devices must be turned off and placed in the student's lockers upon arriving at school. These devices are often a distraction to students, and are not permitted to be with students during the day. Thanks for your cooperation!

From the Office:

School fees can be paid in the office.

Deliveries for Students:

Jerusalem Elementary has implemented a system for items to be delivered to students once the day begins. Please leave items on the table outside the office door, complete the delivery log, and notify the secretary of your delivery. Thanks for your cooperation!

School Supplies:

This year, we have decided to purchase a variety of school supplies for each classroom to start the year. This allowed us to decrease the number of items that parents are responsible for purchasing.

Morning Drop-Off Routine:

Please see the following important information involving the morning drop-off routine for students. Students will not be permitted to enter the building until **8:50 am**. Please do not let your child(ren) exit the vehicle until the main entrance doors are opened. Thanks for your cooperation!

- Please drive slowly.
- Please drop off your student(s) **between** the Safety Markers (plastic figures with flags). Do not drop off outside of this zone.
- Please stay in the car drop-off line until your child(ren) exits the vehicle. Do not drive around other vehicles to move ahead in line, or to exit the lot.
- Please have any and all children in your vehicle exit on the building/driver side of the vehicle.
- **Do not park in the drop off line.** We need to keep the traffic moving. It is preferred that students are dropped off in the identified zone, rather than walked into the building. If you need to enter the building for an appointment you must park your vehicle in a parking space, and carefully walk your child(ren) into the building.

Thank you for following these procedures, as we all work together to make the arrival process safe for students, parents, and staff.

Parent Pick Up Cards:

If you plan on picking up your child(ren) from school, please see Mrs. Freimark in the office for a set of Parent Pick Up Cards unless you have yours from last year.

Student Dismissal:

To help with the flow of traffic, parent pick-up students will be dismissed to the main entrance beginning at 3:30 pm. Please be sure to have your pick-up card out, and your child(ren)'s card attached to their book bag in a visible location. Please be patient with this process. If you don't have a parent pick-up card, you will be asked to enter the office and provide your ID.

Pick up cards will be available to be signed out on the 17th, 18th and 21st. Please stop in the office.

For your child(ren)'s safety, we will only release students to parents/guardians with matching pickup cards that are waiting in the lobby.

From Officer Jeff:

Dear Parents / Grandparents,

This is the time of the year when we see very high unexcused absence hours for some of our Jerusalem Elementary students, which is always of great concern. Please make sure if your child is off due to illness, you are obtaining a doctor's note if possible. Ohio H.B. 410 requirements only allow for a child to be out of school, without a legitimate reason for 72 hours during a school year. Since our days account for 6 hours, it is important to bring in a written doctor's note if your child has missed a considerable amount of time during the year, so these hours can be excused. Principal Straka and I will work with many families regularly to develop a student absence intervention plan, if we notice a concern with your child's attendance. If we do not see improvement with your child's attendance following this student absence intervention plan, the next step may require me (Officer Jeff) to consult the City of Oregon Prosecutor about filing a criminal charge against the custodial parent, or parents. This Oregon Municipal Code is 539.01 Parental Responsibility. It is of utmost importance as a parent, you are doing your part to encourage your children to attend school regularly, so they can obtain their education. If you have any questions, please feel free to contact me.

Grade Level and Team Updates:

Kindergarten- Thank you to everyone who has already sent back their grade card envelopes! If you have not done so please sign it and return it ASAP. Keep working at home on the words and reading every night! We are all looking forward to celebrating Easter and the beginning of spring break this week! Spring break is from March 29- April 8. We will see everyone back at school on April 9.

1st Grade- Next week, students will be reading and writing words with oa vowel teams, like in the word, boat. Our spelling test will be on Thursday 3/28. In Wonders lesson 5.4, students will discuss sounds and how different materials can create different sounds. We will read, "Whistle for Willie", "Now, What's That Sound?" and "I Don't Want to Be a Frog". In Bigldeas math, Chapter 9 is on adding two-digit numbers. Next week is a four day week, having Good Friday off and followed by Spring

Break! On Thursday, students will have an Imagination Station Science Fest, it will be a fun week before break. We hope everyone has a great weekend!


When it comes to medicine the 5 T's are: Don't Touch, Don't Taste, Don't Take! Tell a Trusted Adult!
