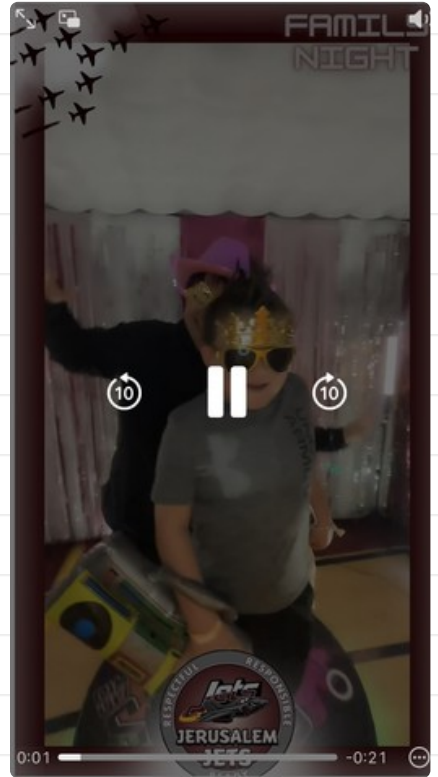




Spring Family Night!

Lucas County Children Services is encouraging everyone who lives, works, plays or attends school in our community to **WEAR BLUE** on April 10, 2024.

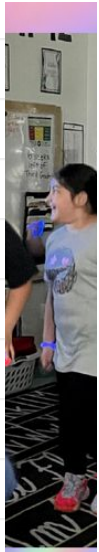



Throughout the next few months, we will begin the process of planning for next year. This includes assessing our master schedule, the effectiveness of our curricular programs, establishing our staffing needs, and, of course, creating class lists for the 2024-2025 school year.

This process of creating class lists requires time and careful consideration. Initially, your child's teacher will review his/her current class list. During this stage, your child's teacher will indicate the academic and behavioral needs of individual students. This information along with the overall composition of the class is considered in order to make the best possible classroom assignment for each student.

If you feel that a particular learning situation may be more appropriate for your child, you are asked to complete the [K-2 Teacher Request Form](#) so that it can be taken into consideration. Completed forms, with specific information that may help place a child in the most appropriate setting, need to be submitted by the end of April.

Due to the structure of the 3rd and 4th grade schedules, and the teacher's individual teaching assignments, requests for these grades will not be taken.

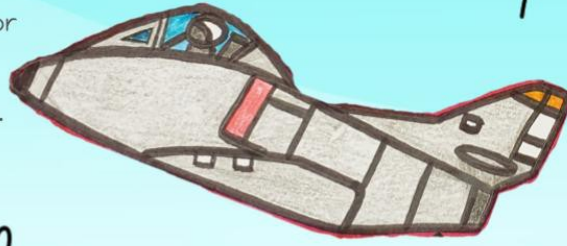

Zones of Regulation:

Throughout the past couple of school years, a select group of teachers have been introducing the idea of ZONES into their classrooms. At this point, students in grade K-3 have a good foundation about this self-regulation program. Please take a moment to read the letter created by Mrs. Kellar, summarizing the idea behind ZONES.



The **ZONES** of Regulation is a valuable tool for helping elementary students recognize and manage their emotions, which is crucial for their social and emotional development. It's designed to help children understand and communicate their feelings and, in turn, develop self-regulation skills. When children understand their emotions, how those emotions affect their behavior, and how to self-regulate, they are able to achieve an optimal state of alertness. This program has been introduced to students in grades K through 3rd grade.

The program categorizes emotions into four color-coded zones:

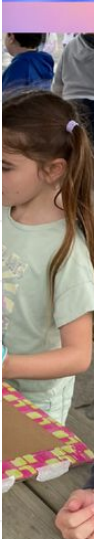
- **Blue Zone (Sad, Tired, Sick, or Slow):** In this zone, children might feel sad, tired, or unwell. They may feel like resting or needing comfort.
- **Green Zone (Happy, Calm, Focused, or Ready to Learn):** This is the ideal zone for learning and socializing. Children in the green zone feel calm, focused, and ready to engage with their peers and learning activities.
- **Yellow Zone (Excited, Frustrated, Worried, or Anxious):** In this zone, children experience heightened emotions. They might feel anxious, excited, or frustrated. It's a signal to be aware and use self-regulation strategies.
- **Red Zone (Angry, Scared, Terrified, or Excited or Explosive):** This is the zone where strong and intense emotions are felt. Children might feel very angry, scared, or out of control. It's essential to help them regulate back to the green zone from the red zone.

Learning to use the Zones includes self-regulation strategies such as deep breathing, mindfulness techniques, taking a break, talking to a trusted adult, or using sensory tools like fidgets or stress balls. Parents are encouraged to work with their children on identifying which strategies work best for them.

Parents play a crucial role in reinforcing the concepts taught in the Zones of Regulation program. They can practice the program's language at home, provide a safe space for their child to express their feelings, and model appropriate emotional regulation.

ClassDojo:

ClassDojo is a communication app for the classroom. It connects teachers, parents, and students who use it to share photos, videos, and messages through the school day. They use **ClassDojo** to work together as a team, share in the classroom experience, and bring big ideas to life in their classrooms and homes. Jerusalem teachers may be using ClassDojo in a variety of ways within their classroom throughout the school year. Not all teachers are currently using this tool within their classroom at this time, as it is their choice. Some teachers will continue to communicate with parents through email, phone, newsletters, etc. **However, we encourage you to sign up for ClassDojo to receive important building updates/messages from Mr. Straka.** Information on signing up for ClassDojo will be sent home from your child's teacher.

Cell Phones and other electronic devices:

Just a reminder that all cell phones, smartwatches, and other personal electronic devices must be turned off and placed in the student's lockers upon arriving at school. These devices are often a distraction to students, and are not permitted to be with students during the day. Thanks for your cooperation!

From the Office:

School fees can be paid in the office.

As we are starting to wear coats, please write your students name in the coat/sweatshirt/hoodie somewhere. There are MANY lost items in the Gym hallway.

Parent pickup at the end of the day. All calls should be made by 3:00 and no later. This will give the teacher time to check messages and drastically reduce the possibility of the student being in the



Deliveries for Students:

Jerusalem Elementary has implemented a system for items to be delivered to students once the day begins. **Please leave items on the table outside the office door**, complete the delivery log, and notify the secretary of your delivery. Thanks for your cooperation!

School Supplies:

This year, we have decided to purchase a variety of school supplies for each classroom to start the year. This allowed us to decrease the number of items that parents are responsible for purchasing.

Morning Drop-Off Routine:

Please see the following important information involving the morning drop-off routine for students. Students will not be permitted to enter the building until **8:50 am**. Please do not let your child(ren) exit the vehicle until the main entrance doors are opened. Thanks for your cooperation!

- Please drive **slowly**.
- Please drop off your student(s) **between** the Safety Markers (plastic figures with flags). Do not drop off outside of this zone.
- Please stay in the car drop-off line until your child(ren) exits the vehicle. Do not drive around other vehicles to move ahead in line, or to exit the lot.
- Please have any and all children in your vehicle exit on the **building/driver side** of the vehicle.
- **Do not park in the drop off line.** We need to keep the traffic moving. It is preferred that students are dropped off in the identified zone, rather than walked into the building. If you need to enter the building for an appointment you must park your vehicle in a parking space, and carefully walk your child(ren) into the building.

Thank you for following these procedures, as we all work together to make the arrival process safe for students, parents, and staff.

Parent Pick Up Cards:

If you plan on picking up your child(ren) from school, please see Mrs. Freimark in the office for a set of Parent Pick Up Cards unless you have yours from last year.

Student Dismissal:

To help with the flow of traffic, parent pick-up students will be dismissed to the main entrance beginning at 3:30 pm. Please be sure to have your pick-up card out, and your child(ren)'s card attached to their book bag in a visible location. Please be patient with this process. If you don't have a parent pick-up card, you will be asked to enter the office and provide your ID.

Pick up cards will be available to be signed out on the 17th, 18th and 21st. Please stop in the office.

For your child(ren)'s safety, we will only release students to parents/guardians with matching pick-up cards that are waiting in the lobby.

From Officer Jeff:

Parents please speak with your children about strangers / danger lessons, we continue to conduct drills on the playground testing their situational awareness. Ask your children about these drills and continue to encourage them. Please keep reinforcing "If they see something, hear something, say something." These drills will continue, so we can make them more aware of their surroundings. We also discuss the importance of being able to maintain our personal space. We discuss strength in numbers, and how important it is for them to utilize the buddy system. We never want them to be left unattended, there should always be a trusted adult near them all the time. We encourage them to report suspicious persons, or vehicles to their trusted adults immediately. As your children continue to be exposed to these stranger / danger drills, they will continue to learn more basic life survival skills. As a parent you have a tremendous amount of responsibility to keep your children safe, if you have any questions or concerns please reachout to me. Your children will continue to learn these important skills every year at Jerusalem Elementary School. Thanks, Officer Jeff

Grade Level and Team Updates:

Kindergarten- There is a lot going on with Kindergarten! Our field trip to Pearson Park, and Clay High School is on Tuesday April 30, please send in the permission slip if you have not already. Our ABC countdown has started, and this week we have Monday C-Craft day, Tuesday D-drawing day, Wednesday E- experiment day, Thursday F-favorite book day (don't forget to send in your favorite book!) and Friday G- game day. Our Kindergarten concert is coming up on May 16th. In math we continue to work on addition and subtraction. Keep reading for the April reading calendar and practicing your words every night. The school year is going fast and there is lots going on so please make sure to check Class Dojo regularly for updates.

1st Grade- Next week in first grade, students will read and write using the sound /ay/, as in the word, stay. We will read, ask and answer questions about how things get built. We'll read "Building Bridges", "Wangari's Trees of Peace" and "The Joy of a Ship". In Big Ideas Math, students will begin Chapter 12 on telling time. On Thursday the 25th, all of First Grade will perform their Spring Concert. Students are asked to be at Jerusalem at 6, the concert will begin at 6:30. We hope to see you there!

2nd Grade- The Second Graders have had a busy week preparing for the Wax Museum on April 26th! The students spent time in class practicing their speeches and preparing their display board. Your child should continue to practice their speech at home. Please encourage your child to use



appropriate voice volume, good eye contact, and a clear speaking voice when reading their speech. Also, make sure your child has a costume/props ready to bring to school on April 26th. The 2nd Graders are looking forward to sharing their speeches next week at our Wax Museum! Here is the schedule of when each class will give their presentations: Ostrander: 9:30-10:15a.m., Schultze: 10:30-11:15a.m., Singlar: 1:15-1:45p.m. Keep in mind the 2nd Grade Spring Concert on Tuesday, April 23rd at Jerusalem, students should arrive at 6:00 p.m. Have a wonderful weekend!

3rd Grade- We are so proud of our 3rd graders! They worked hard on the Reading OST this week! We will have one more week of OST testing on May 1st and May 2nd. All 3rd graders will take the Math test in the morning. In our studies next week, we will be reading a chapter book on the Titanic disaster. - Student follows class and school rules.

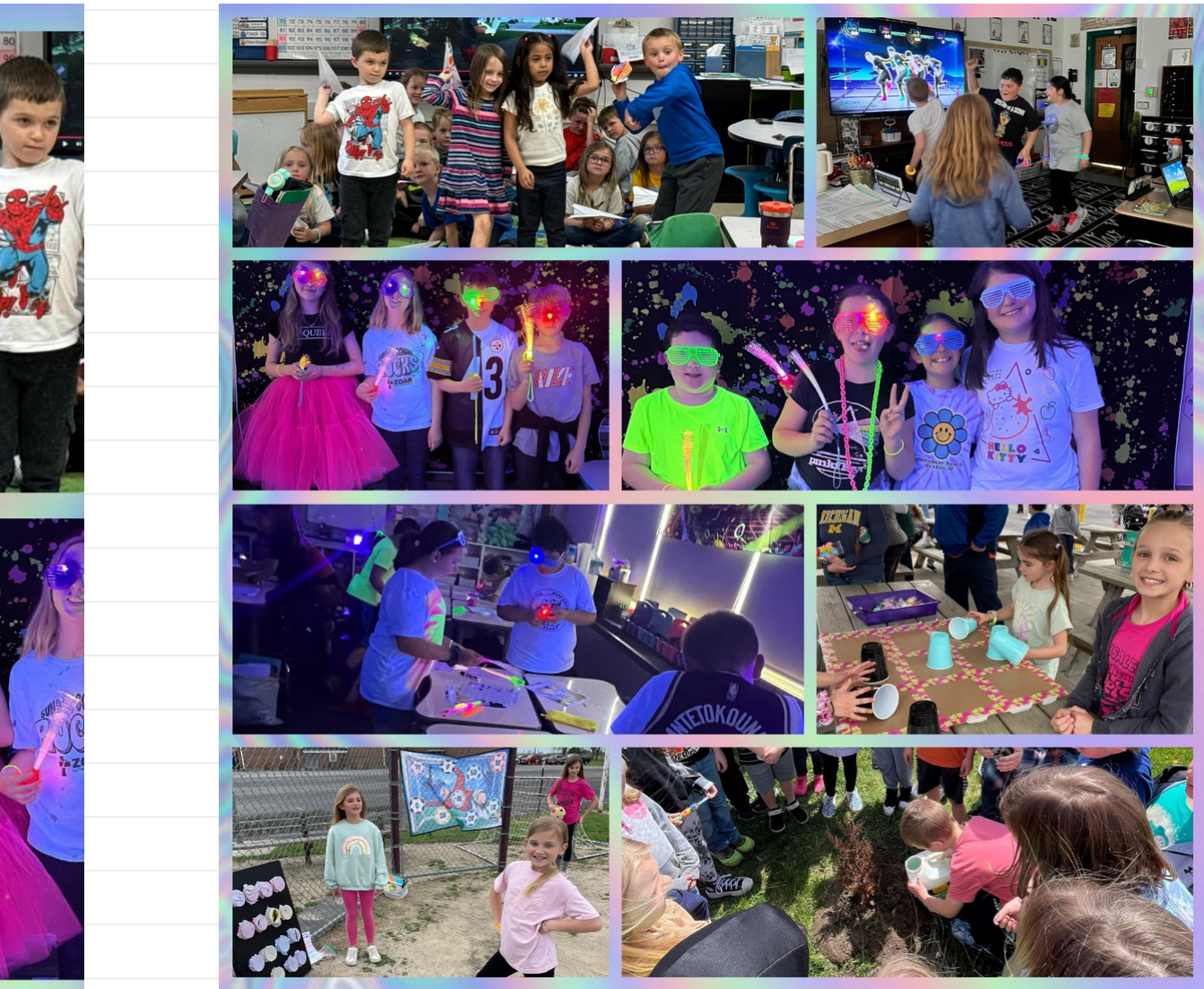
READY
