The Ohio Department of Health regulations indicate that a pupil may be admitted to school on a parent/guardian's written statement that the child has had the measles and or mumps disease. HOWEVER, IN THE EVENT A MEASLES OR MUMPS OUTBREAK (ONE CASE) OCCURS OR THREATENS THE SCHOOL, ONLY PUPILS HAVING A RECORD OF MEASLES OR MUMPS VACCINE OR A PHYSICIAN-CERTIFIED (NOT PARENT CERTIFIED) STATEMENT OF A HISTORY OF MEASLES AND MUMPS DISEASE WILL BE CONSIDERED IMMUNE. Students are encouraged to receive the vaccine(s) if their history of measles or mumps disease is questionable in any way and cannot be certified by a Licensed Health Care Provider. Similarly, children who are admitted under medical/religious/philosophical waiver will lose the privilege to attend school should a measles or mumps case occur in, or threaten the school. The period of exclusion for "exempt" pupils during a measles or mumps outbreak will normally last no less than two weeks, and the exclusion period could last for one or more months. The first dose of measles, mumps, and rubella vaccines or MMR combined immunization must have been given at age one or older. The second dose must have been given at least thirty(30) days after the first. All students entering grades kindergarten through grade 12 will be required to have this second dose.
