



Welcome Back!



PHYSICAL EDUCATION UPDATE

Physical Education

Dear Parent and/or Guardian,

My name is Jeremiah Przybylski and I will be your child/children's PE teacher this year. This is my 23ndh year teaching in the Oregon school system and my 15th here at Starr. I would like to take this opportunity to give you a little information about our P.E. program and to let you know what will be expected of your child/children.

Program Goal:

Throughout the year the students will be provided a wide variety of experiences designed to promote healthy physical and social development. It is my goal to develop each child's physical skills and to give them a general appreciation for movement and exercise so that they will leave with the tools necessary to lead a physically active lifestyle.

Dress:

Students should be dressed comfortably and be wearing tennis shoes in order to participate safely in our PE activities. Belts should be worn with loose fitting pants and dresses or skirts should be worn with shorts or tights underneath. Students will not be permitted to participate without appropriate attire. Shoes with a raised heel are not considered appropriate.

Instruction:

Grades K-2 will focus mainly on the development of basic movement, skill, and wellness concepts, as well as some low-level team and group activity. Students will practice a variety of ways to travel, change direction and speed, and different ways to balance, jump, and land. They will practice basic skills such as kicking, striking, throwing, catching, and tumbling, and they will be introduced to a few basic fitness concepts. Traits such as a positive attitude, strong work ethic, and good sportsmanship will also be reinforced daily.

Grades 3-5 will spend less time on basic skill development and more time putting these skills to practice through sports and other group activities. These students will also spend more time becoming familiar with fitness concepts and how to apply them.

Discipline:

In order to maintain an environment that is safe and conducive to learning, students breaking the class rules and/or causing a disruption will be issued a discipline referral slip and/or receive negative Dojo points. Students may also be asked to take a 5-minute break from the class activity if I feel that it would be beneficial to the students.

Assessment:

Students will receive grades based on the extent to which they meet the state standards for physical education. Activity observation, skill testing, and written assignments will all be used in the assessment process. Like music, PE grades will be issued after the 2nd and 4th semesters and will be based on a 3-point scale. Kindergartners do not receive a grade in PE. Visit education.ohio.gov to view the state standards for physical education.

Kindergarten Color Days!




