2023 Oregon Safety Town Registration

SAFETY TOWN is an organized program of safety education for children entering kindergarten from Oregon and the surrounding communities. SAFETY TOWN, a city built to a child's scale, is the setting in which safety awareness is taught and practiced. Teachers, police and fire personnel, with the assistance of teenage volunteers, will cover such topics as pedestrian, motorist, bus, railroad, water, and a variety of other safety related topics.

Movies, songs, games, and practice inside SAFETY TOWN will complement the daily classroom activities.

Each session is five days (see below for times). All children must be potty-trained.

SAFETY TOWN is sponsored by the Oregonian Club, in cooperation with the City of Oregon's Police and Fire Departments and the Oregon City Schools. SAFETY TOWN is located at 3230 Starr Avenue (Starr Elementary School) and is offered in two sessions. Limit of 60 students per session.

Session 1: June 5th - 9th (8:00 am - 11:30 am) with Graduation on June 9th at 10:30 am Session 2: June 12th - 16th (8:00 am - 11:30 am) with Graduation on June 16th at 10:30 am

A required registration fee of \$30 must be paid before May 19, 2023. A full refund if cancelled before May 26, 2023 and a partial refund of \$10 if before June 2, 2023. 


